

FORMER NEBRASKA GRID PLAYER STARS

**Guy Chamberlain Wins Praise for
Work on Professional Chi-
cago Team.**

Guy Chamberlain, star end of the Husker football teams of '14 and '15, has been winning honors on the gridiron the past season, playing end for the Staley's, a professional team of Chicago. Included in the Staley's lineup are "Chick" Harley and Pete Stinchcomb, all-American men and former Ohio State stars.

Last Sunday in a contest played against the Canton Bulldogs, one of the greatest professional teams in the country and captained by the peerless Jim Thorne, Chamberlain received a pass from Harley and scored the only touchdown of the game. Stinchcomb added three more points to the total by a field goal. The final count was Staley's 10, Canton 0.

Chamberlain is rated as one of the greatest gridiron performers who ever wore the Scarlet and cream. He was a brilliant and elusive open field runner and had exceptional ability to

catch forward passes. He is a member of Beta Theta Pi fraternity.
