The training received is free to all girls who are interested and should be especially beneficial to prospective teachers. **PROF. CHAS. W. TAYLOR CANDIDATE FOR OFFICE**

Charles W. Taylor, professor in the Teachers College, is a candidate for State Superintendent of Public Instruction. He has had direct charge of student high school teachers in training in the Teachers College for the past ten years. Almost fifteen hundred high school teachers have passed through his hands in these ten years.

In 1917 Professor Taylor enlisted, on leave of absence from the University, and served in machine gun work

until the close of the war at which time he returned to his work here at the University.

Professor Taylor will not resume his duties here in the college if he is successful in this election.

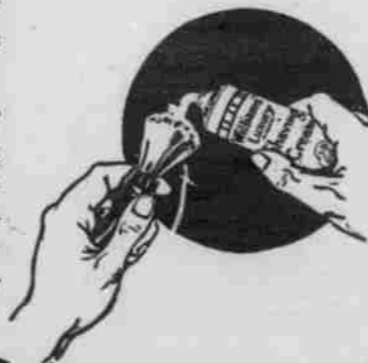
