Duggan, chairman of the Educational Committee of nounces that 5,000 students in 100 colleges in this country and abroad have contributed to the fund for establishing a series of annual rewards as a tribute to the ideals of the former president whose name the fund bears. Princeton has designated one day, during which about fifty graduates subscribedto the fund. It is the plan to raise \$1,000,000 by subscription. Cleveland H.
