

HOLD EXAMS FOR ARMY OFFICERS

September 4 is the Date Set For Examining Men For Second Lieutenants

Examination for the appointment of second lieutenants in the regular army will be held during the week beginning September 4, according to an announcement from the military department. The examination will be opened to the following classes of eligibles:

- (a) Warrant officers or enlisted men having not less than two years of service.
- (b) Reserve officers or members of the enlisted reserve corps.
- (c) Officers, warrant officers and

enlisted men of the national guard. (d) Graduates of technical institutions approved by the secretary of war.

The age limits are between 21 and 30 years. Any civilians of the required age who pass the preliminary examination may become eligible to take the final examination by entering either class b or c.

The examination is not for an announced number of vacancies. The appropriation act for the fiscal year 1923 provides for 1771 second lieutenants. The number of vacancies on December 31, 1922, is expected to be greater than the number of qualified candidates. Appointment of successful candidates will be given as soon as practicable after January 1, 1923.

Applications should be forwarded to the commanding general, 7th corps area, army building, Omaha, and should contain data as to age, rank and organization, married or single, schools attended and colleges or universities from which graduated, two letters of recommendation as to the moral fitness of the candidate.

Norfolk, Walthill, Orleans, Ashland, North Bend, Fremont and Broken Bow. This list will be added to before the books close.

STATE TENNIS TOURNAMENT SOON

More Than 100 Expected to Compete For Nebraska Title on University Courts.

More than 100 tennis players are expected to enroll for the annual tournament of the Nebraska tennis association which will be held on the university courts from August 7 to 12. The entries must all be in by 10 o'clock next Monday morning.

Rev. John Galvert, Methodist minister of Plattsmouth and Omaha city champion in 1917 will be the official referee at the tourney.

First round drawings will be made immediately following the closing of the entry books next Monday. First round play will start soon after the drawings are completed and will continue almost constantly every day until the end of the tournament Saturday.

None of the present state title holders will enter the state meet. Ralph Powell, last year champion, is now in Europe and the doubles champions of last year are Californians. They cannot enter this year since only Nebraska tennis players are eligible.

Omaha is expected to send a field of fifteen players and Lincoln will probably enter a like number. Other towns which have already had men entered in the tournament are Seward, Holdrege, Plattsmouth, Arapahoe, Milford, Doniphan, Grand Island, Alliance.
