

NOTRE DAME PLANS ANNUAL HOMECOMING

Celebration to Be Held November 3 and 4—Indiana Game to Be Feature.

Notre Dame, Ind., Oct. 26.—The greatest homecoming celebration in the history of Notre Dame is expected Friday and Saturday, November 3 and 4, when thousands of old students will be included in the crowd of 20,000 people who will witness the Indiana-Notre Dame football game which will be the central event of the celebration.

Preparations have been in progress for months to care for the alumni of both Notre Dame and Indiana, who will witness the game. The seating capacity of Cartier Field has been increased by 8,000 for this game and the biggest crowd in history will swarm into the field. Twelve thousand reserved seats placed on sale last Monday were snapped up immediately.

A committee of fifty students, appointed by the Students' Activity Committee of the school, has arranged for the reception and entertainment of the visitors. Information booths and vehicles will be provided for all visitors at the railroad stations. Both campus and city will be decorated and prizes will be awarded for the best bedecked buildings.

The celebration will be formally opened Friday evening when 1,500

students will march from the University to South Bend and stage a snake dance through the city streets to the Oliver hotel, where the Indiana team will be welcomed at a pep meeting which will include 5,000 voices of students and city residents. Following this the party will return to the University where a medley entertainment in Washington Hall will be followed by a program of boxing bouts in the gymnasium.

Saturday's demonstration will be opened with a barbecue on the campus at 10 o'clock in the morning. A preliminary football game between South Bend high and Cathedral high school of Grand Rapids will precede the Notre Dame-Indiana battle of bitter rivals. Four dances will be given in the evening to complete the celebration.—By Frank Wallace, Notre Dame.

New Excuse System On Trial in College

A change has been made in the system of checking up absences in the college, in the hope of eliminating confusion and slowness.

The new method consists of a system of absence cards. On one side of the card is space for the name of the student, the name of the courses, the time, the date, the dean's signature, and the instructors' initials. On the other is space for the statement of the student's excuse and the signature of some recognized authority such as house-mother or physician.

A letter from the dean's office was sent to each of the members of the college faculty with an enclosed sample of the absence cards. In this communication it was made clear that

the card is not to be taken as an official excuse exempting the student from making up the work missed. It is used as a means of conveying to the instructor the reasons for the absence of the student.

The new system is being tried in the college in the hope that it will save time and confusion in aiding the student in reinstating himself in his classes. Formerly a student's excuse for absence was not available until after ten or fourteen days.—The University Daily Kansan.

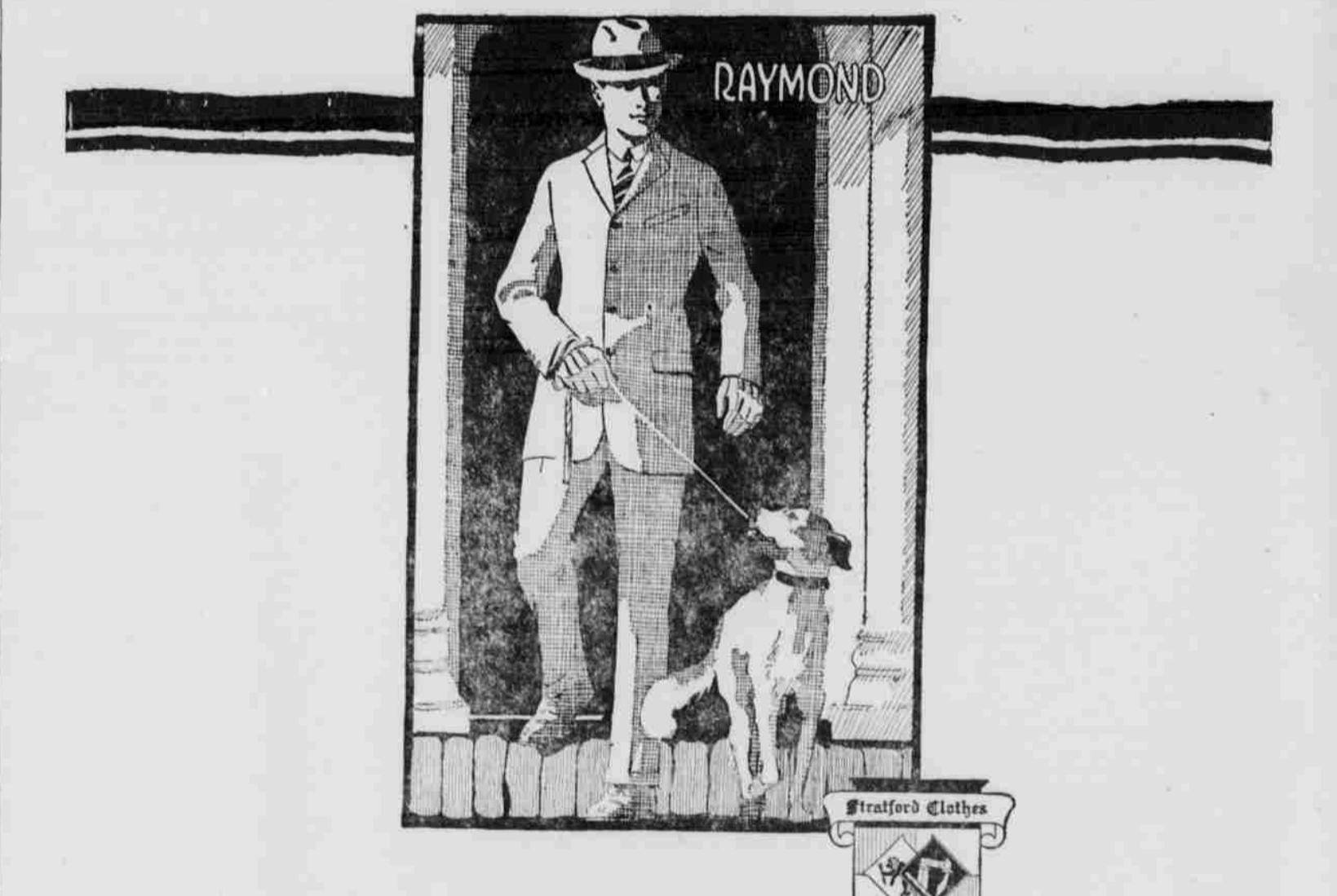
