Ames Cyclones Invade the Scarlet and Cream Camp

HUSKER ELEVEN WILL BATTLE FOR VALLEY CHAMPIONSHIP TOMORROW

Coach Dawson Expects to Use Long String of Substitutes in Contest With Iowa Farmers; May Use Russell, Herb Dewitz, and Lewellen at Pilot Position Against Aps

NEBRASKA TOP-HEAVY FAVORITE FOR COMING CONTEST
Iowans Are Counted on to Put Up a Hard Fight—Captain Walters Will Only be Able to Play Part of the Game—Coach Willamen Hopes to Hold Huskers to Low Score

Nebraska must defeat Ames tomorrow afternoon in order to clinch the championship of the Missouri Valley. Coach Dawson of the Huskers has been sending his men through a series of hard scrimmages this week, preparatory to the Cyclone fray. The Ames Farmers, who have not been going well this season, are not taken very seriously by the Scarlet and Cream gridsters, and so it is expected that Dawson will insert a number of second-stringers in the contest.

The game will start at 2:30 on Nebraska Field. The University band and the Corncobs will be out for the game. A large delegation of Ames rooters is coming to Lincoln for the game.

The Huskers went through a stiff scrimmage with the Yearlings last night. The freshmen used Cyclone and Hoosier formations against the Varsity. The Varsity practiced a number of forward pass plays against the first-year gridsters with varying success. A complete second team ran through signals, and it is possible that Dawson will use this second team against the Cyclones. Coach Dawson has been using Herb Dewitz, Lewellen and Russel at quarter this week, and it is possible that he will use all three of these backs at the pilot position against the Iowans.

Coach Willamen of Ames has been working his men hard this week in preparation for the invasion of the Nebraska camp. Captain Walters of the Aggies has been on the injured list for the last two games, and he will not be able to play more than a small part of the contest with the Huskers.

The Cyclones have a reputation for putting up their hardest fight against Nebraska, and it is expected that Saturday's contest will furnish no exception. Last year Ames fooled the Nebraska team, fresh from the Pitt victory, when they scored a field goal in the first five minutes of play. Three years ago, in 1919, the Iowans upset all hope when they came to Lincoln and defeated the Huskers, 3 to 0.

Y. M. C. A. SPONSORS CROSS COUNTRY MEET
University and High School Runners Urged to Enter—Fraternity Men May Practice Here
Twenty men of the University entered in the short cross-country run to be held Saturday at 1:30 under the auspices of the local Y. M. C. A. Coach McMaster again advises all men who expect to run in the coming meet between the fraternities to run in this Y. M. C. A. meet. It will enable them to get some competition which they would otherwise be unable to get in their nightly practice. The Lincoln Sporting Goods company is offering a trophy which is to be given to the winning team in this race.

The short Varsity course is to be run and the distance is three miles, the same as that of the coming fraternity meet which will be held the second Saturday after Thanksgiving. The men running in this are both high school and University runners, and it is believed that they will run separately—the high school men not having to compete with the University men and vice versa.

Any man running in the high school will have to be entered by his school authorities who will vouch for his training and condition, and will send in a doctor's certificate as to his fitness. This is the same requirement as is made in all high school competition.

The Corncobs will meet the Ames team at the Rock Island depot today at 3:50. Every Cob must be there in uniform ready to give the Iowans a real Nebraska welcome.

Huskers Pulled Down Victory In Combat of 1917

Nebraska decisively outplayed Notre Dame in 1917 in the third game of the Cornhusker-Catholic series. The Cornhuskers won from the Hoosiers, 7 to 0, and grabbed the lead in the grid contests between the two institutions. Since 1917, however, Nebraska has tied one game and lost three to the "Fighting Irish."

The Cornhuskers outplayed Notre Dame more decisively than the score would seem to indicate. The Nebraska completed eleven first downs for a total of 205 yards, while Notre Dame made yardage but once and gained a meagre sixty-three yards from snapback. Penalties at inopportune moments went heavily against the Huskers. Nebraska was penalized 105 yards, while the Catholics were sent back sixty yards.

An electrifying return of Phalen's punt by John Cook, Nebraska halfback, was a potent factor in scoring the touchdown. Cook nabbed Phalen's punt in the second quarter and returned the ball to the Notre Dame 25-yard line, racing 35 yards down the sidelines. A triple pass behind the line of scrimmage, Schellenberg to Cook to Rhodes, gained 20 yards, around Notre Dame's left end and two plunges sent Otoupalik across the Hoosier goal. Summary and lineup:

Michigan Student Is Caught for Scalping

Harold Briskman of Detroit, pleaded guilty to a charge of ticket-scalping at 7:30 o'clock last night before Justice J. D. Thomas, and was fined \$100 and \$5.05 costs, with the alternative of spending sixty days in the Washtenaw county jail.

Briskman was apprehended by officers, it was charged, while disposing of two tickets for yesterday's Michigan-Wisconsin football game for \$5 each. Briskman claimed that he was not selling the tickets at a profit, but that he had paid the same price at which he was later said to have been selling them, and that he had sold them only because he met a friend who gave him two other tickets.

Justice Thomas, however, questioned Briskman's story, and declared that he had been determined to deal severely with the first case of the
