

GREEKS TO HOLD TRACK MEET ON BOARDS

COACH SCHULTE PLANS CONTEST FOR NEXT WEEK

Competition in Various Events Conducted on Different Days—Pentathlon System Used.

TWO EVENTS EACH DAY

Two Athletes from Every Organization Must Take Part in Each Event—Begins February 20.

An inter-fraternity track meet on the board track, an event unprecedented in Cornhusker athletic history, has been planned by Track Coach Henry F. Schulte to begin next Monday, February 20, and continue all week. Competition will be conducted in all events, and a point system resembling the high school pentathlon point system will be used as a basis of awards. By means of this system, a premium will be placed on individual performance rather than on the place won.

Order of Events.

- February 20—440 yard dash, 12-pound shot put.
- February 21—50 yard low hurdles, running broad jump.
- February 22—50 yard dash, running high jump.
- February 23—Mile run, pole vault.
- February 24—50 yard high hurdles, javelin throw.
- February 26—66 yard run, pole vault.
- February 27—880 yard run, 16 pound shot put.

Rules.

1. Two events will be run each day beginning February 20.
2. Each fraternity may compete more, but not less, than two men in each event.
3. The two best performances for each group in each event will be figured on a 1000 point basis each.
4. The total of the two highest men will stand as the total for that group for that event.
5. The fraternity which shows the highest grand total will be declared the winner.
6. No one man may take part in more than six events.
7. The master sheet showing the point scoring in each event will be on the Track Bulletin Board in the gym.
8. A committee of "N men" will run off the meet.

All contestants must report promptly at one of the following hours each day: 3:15, 4:15, 5:15. If you cannot appear at 3:15, then come promptly at the 4:15 or 5:15 hours.

NOTE—Each fraternity shall appoint one man as track manager who shall be responsible for the appearance of the men from his group.

NOTE—Each fraternity must deposit \$1.00 with Herbert Gish before February 15. This deposit will be used to secure a first and second place trophy skin. A fraternity that does not compete two or more men in each event cannot be eligible for placing in the meet.

HUSKERS DROP SLOW CONTEST TO JAYHAWKERS

Basket Shooting of Kansas Quintet Too Much for Cornhusker Defense Work.

ACKERMAN HIGH SCORER

Usher Leads Nebraska Five in Points—Next Game with Kansas Aggies Friday Night.

Kansas continued her clean sweep of the Missouri Valley Conference basketball circles by winning from Nebraska 36 to 15 on the Armory floor Monday night. The Kansas team outplayed the Huskers in every department of the game and the outcome was never in doubt at any time during the evening performance.

The Jayhawker quintet used fast passing system and never resorted to shots of the long variety throughout the game. The Kansas forwards broke through the Nebraska defenses repeatedly and when smothered shot the ball back to the center of the floor where the Kansas guard, Black, was ready to try for the hoop.

Nebraska took the lead with a free goal at the start following with a field goal by Capt. Warren, but this margin did not last long when the Jayhawker forwards found the hoop and finished the opening frame on the long end of a 6 to 16 tally.

Russell started the second half for Nebraska at center and soon Cozier and Volz were sent in but the combination did not seem to help as the Kansas quintet drew away to an 8 to 28 lead.

The second half was further featured by a slowness which marked the whole game and when the Ka-

sas coach ran in a complete new team the last seven minutes the performance was not speeded up any.

Ackerman, crack Kansas forward, counted 14 of the Jayhawkers' total scoring, gleaming two field goals and ten free hops, not missing a single chance from behind the foul line. Wulf, center, and Black, guard, tied with three field goals apiece.

Usher, Nebraska diminutive forward, slipped in one long field throw and repeated the performance of Ackerman by caging every one of his free trials. Warren and Klepser each made one hoop from the court and Warren added to his total of points from the free circle.

The last seven minutes of the closing frame saw the score sheet free-

from tallies with occasional attempts from the middle of the floor by Usher. Husker quintet. Kansas likewise saw her substitutes fail at numerous attempts to find the hoop though the second stringers were free to toss in the ring many times.
