400 Men Compete in Greatest

The Delta Tau Delta athletes won the first annual inter-fraternity mid-winter track championship, scoring a total of 19,796 points, while the Alpha Sigs, who captured second-honors, tallied 18,021. The Sig Eps were third and the Acacias fourth. The Greek mid-winter track meet, which was instituted by Coach Schulte, began last Tuesday, and was concluded yesterday afternoon when the final events, the 12-pound shot put and the half

mile, were conducted. The meet was the most successful ever held at Nebraska, it being estimated that 400 men competed in the tourney.

Interest in the meet has been at high pitch ever since the first events were held last week, and some of the closest competition and best intra-mural performances that have ever been witnessed at the Cornhusker school featured the contest. Eighteen fraternities entered teams in the meet. The pentathlon system of scoring was unusually satisfactory and was largely responsible for the success of the meet.

Myers of the Deltas carried off first honors in the 12-pound shot put yesterday, the husky Beatrice athlete heaving the ball forty-nine feet, one and one-half inches. Henry Bassett of the A. T. O.'s took second place in the shot by tossing the weight forty-six feet and one-half inch.

The fastest time in the 880-yard run was made by Haskell of the Alpha Sigs, who completed the six laps in 2:10.1. Wier of the Farm House tracksters was second. His time was 2:11.1. Hartman of the Farm House was third.

Trophies will be awarded to the Deltas and Alpha Sigs, who won first and second places, respectively. The hexathlon competition which has been held in conjunction with the meet, has not been finished. The six-event athletes are now in the following order, with not all performances completed: Myers, first; Weir, second; Locke, third; Rhodes, fourth; Gish, fifth. Of this quintet, Weir, Locke and Rhodes are yearlings.

Nebraska Five Closes Season  
This Week with Contests  
with Washington and  
Creighton.

Nebraska's tossers tackle the Washington Pikers and Creighton this week in the curtain event for the Scarlet and Cream basketball season. Friday night the Huskers will meet the Pikers on the Armory floor and Saturday will travel to Omaha and play the Creighton cagers.

Nebraska's basketballers fought a close battle with Washington last week on the St. Louis floor, finally losing 34 to 32 after the game was called to two extra sessions to play off the tie. Washington now stands fourth in the conference so the Pikers should show the Huskers a fine fight.

The feature game of the week will be the tussle with the Omaha prides Saturday evening for the metropolis papers have been razzing the Husker quintet and revenge would be sweet in the Nebraska camp.

Creighton has made a good showing, this year, winning 13 out of 18 games played. Kansas defeated them with the largest score. North Dakota and Marquette were the other teams to defeat the Blue and White squad. The contest with Creighton marks

a renewal of relations with the Omaha school after an athletic breach which has separated the relations of the schools for over ten years.

Nebraska now stands tied with Oklahoma for sixth place in the conference standing. Four victories and eleven defeats have been chalked up

as the Husker record for the season so far.

Kansas and Missouri meet Wednesday of this week to decide the Valley championship. Kansas has a clear record having smothered the Tigers in an early season contest. Missouri defeat of Kansas would result in a split

season as the last year's race when Kansas and Missouri tied for the Valley honors.
