Oklahoma Wins First Game by
4 to 2 Score—Nebraska
Cops Second by Two
Point Margin.

Standard of 500 per cent last week standard of 50 per cent last week by splitting the two game series with the Sooner baseball nine from Oklahoma Friday and Saturday at Rock Island ball park. Oklahoma took the first contest, 4 to 2, and made the prospects dark for the Cornhuskers on the next day. Then Nebraska staged a comeback Saturday and left the visitors on the small end of a 4 to 3 count.

An error by Nebraska in the fourth inning and a double and two singles, resulting in three runs for Oklahoma, lost Nebraska the first game of the series. From then on the Cornhuskers seemed to cast in the sponge, scoring but one remaining run, which was brought in by Collins in the sixth stanza. Both mound kings pitched good ball, Morrison of the invaders allowed but six hits and struck out six. Peterson, Nebraska twirler, had things pretty much his own way with

the exception of the third inning when he allowed three hits. Chancellor Avery opened the home game by pitching the first ball to Dean Engberg.

The Saturday battle found a change of front in the game of the Huskers. Lewellen, on the mound for Nebraska, was the deciding factor of the day. In addition to his serving he took it upon himself to bring in the only home run of the day and the first run of the game, in the third inning. Oklahoma got only seven safeties off him. On the other side of the fence Johnson, Oklahoma, struck out three men and hit three, of his four times at bat during eight innings. Then he was suddenly jerked and the title of losing the game went to Durkee.

Oklahoma scored its three runs in the fourth when Bishop, Groom and Johnson, in a skillful hit and run effort crossed the plate. With the aid of Russell and Volz the Huskers tied the count in the latter part of the inning. It then remained for Captain Carmen to bring in the deciding run in the last frame when he made home on a one-bagger slammed by Gibbs.
