

NEBRASKA TRACKSTERS TO MEET HASKELL INDIANS

INDIANS TO BE HERE SATURDAY FOR DUAL MEET

Team That Defeated Jayhawkers Last Week Will Mix With Southerners on State Fair Grounds.

STIFF WORKOUTS PLANNED

Haskell Team Has Many Strong Men That Will Present Some Very Strong Competition.

The Cornhusker track team, which defeated the Kansas U cinder team last Saturday, will meet the Haskell Indian tracksters next Saturday morning in a dual meet on the State Fair grounds. Coach Schulte plans a series of workouts for his track men in preparation for the meet Saturday. This afternoon at the track team will workout on the fair grounds, the bus leaving the Army at four o'clock sharp.

Although current gossip in the Cornhusker track camp does not rate the Haskell Indians as strong competition, a glance at the performance of several of the Indian track stars would dispell this delusion. Levi, Haskell all-around track star, won second honors in the pentathlon at the Penn Relays a few weeks ago, placing several notches above Norton, the Kansas star. Auge, another Indian track star, is unbeatable in the weight events. The Husky Indian tossed the discus 143 feet at Penn. and heaves the shot well over forty feet. Kipp, star Haskell hurdler, clears the sticks in almost record time.

Among the interesting sidelights on the victory over Kansas last Saturday is the fact that it marked Coach Schulte's thirteenth victory over the Jayhawkers in dual meets. Coach Schulte has lost to the Jayhawkers but once. In the meet with the Jayhawkers twenty Husker athletes scored points for Nebraska, while only thirteen Kansas cinder path artists registered in the score column. The Omaha Medics scored 20 points for Nebraska.

Special Freshman Tryout
A special tryout for all freshmen sprinters will be held in the workout this afternoon on the Fair Grounds. Issenhuth, Hein, Whipperman, Locke, Rhodes, Beerkle, Sheer-

ick, Weir, and Wirsig will compete in the tryouts. The yearling tracksters winning the first four places in the tryout will run on the freshman half-mile relay team which will run against the varsity relay team in a special exhibition race during the Haskell meet next Saturday. The meet with the Haskell Indians will begin at 9:30.

Brookins, star University of Iowa sprinter and hurdler, made a new record in the 220-yard low hurdles in the Iowa-Northwestern dual meet last Saturday. The speedy Hawkeye cleared the sticks in 23 2/5 seconds, a fifth of a second faster than the former world's record held by Bob Simpson of Missouri. When Crites of Nebraska made a new varsity record in the low hurdles last Saturday, he stepped over the barriers in 24 4/5 seconds.

HIGH SCHOOLS WILL MEET ON CINDER TRACK

Eight Teams Entered in Annual Interscholastic Contest—To Be Held Saturday Afternoon.

OMAHA WON EIGHT TIMES

Broken Bow, Winner of Telegraphic Relays Will Be Entered—State's Best to Be Present.

Entries have already begun to be received at the athletic office for the 1923 inter-scholastic track and field championship meet, which will be held on the Fair Grounds track next Saturday afternoon, May 12. Eight schools had sent in their list of athletes yesterday afternoon, and everything points toward one of the most successful meets in the history of the affairs.

Omaha Central, which has won the state track title eight times, including the 1922 championship, sent in its list of athletes Monday. Broken Bow, winner of the high school telegraphic relays, was also on the entry list Monday. Beatrice, Cambridge, Tekamah, Dodge, Crete, and Callaway are other schools already entered.

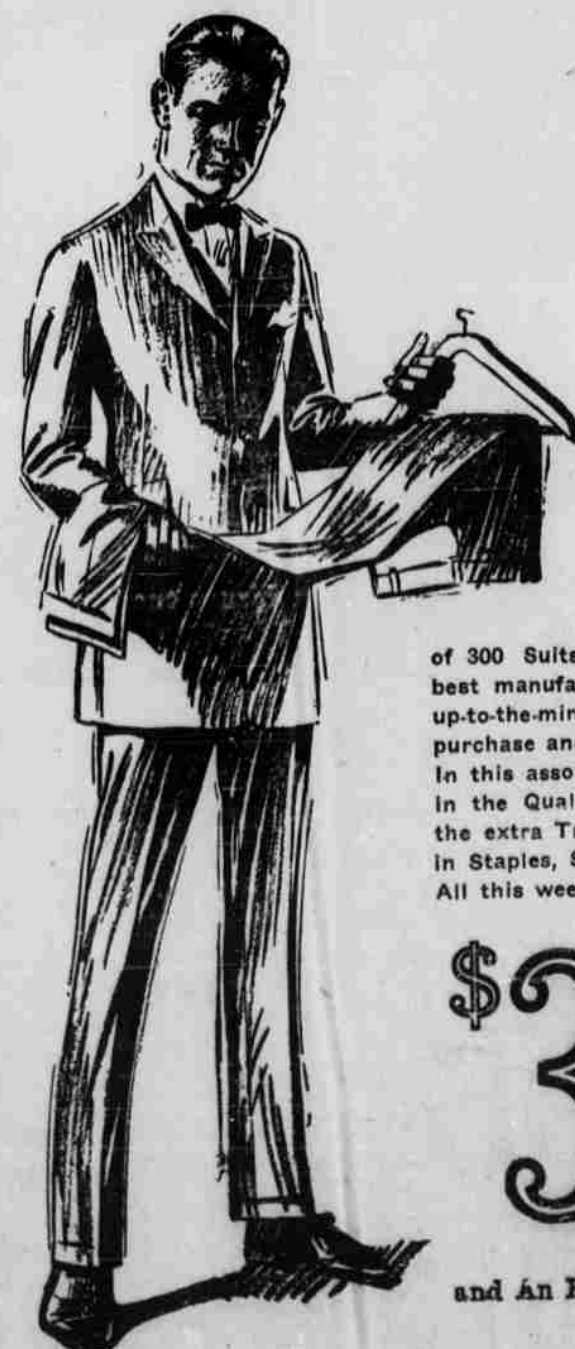
