Dean R. A. Lyman of the College of Pharmacy has been named a member of the advisory committee appointed by the American Conference of Pharmaceutical Faculties to assist Dr. W. W. Chambers of Pittsburgh, Pa., in his study of pharmaceutical education in the United States from a functional point of view.
