**TEACHERS NEEDED TO SERVE IN PHILIPPINES**  
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will amount to the requirements of any one.

Entrance salaries are usually about \$1500, but all appointees are eligible to promotion up to \$2,250 a year as supervisors or teachers. All applicants are required to sign a two-year contract. Women applicants must have reached their thirtieth birthday at the time of filing their application. Men must be 21 but not over 45.

The civil service of the Philippines offers excellent opportunities in the matter of both salary and promotion. Promotions may be made on the basis of merit from the lowest to the highest positions, and the records indicate that qualified appointees have been rapidly advanced. A liberal pension law provides for life annuities after twenty years of service. The bureau is primarily interested in English teachers. The native teachers are accepted more kindly by the students, but they are not so well qualified to teach English as the Americans.
