**COCHRAN APPOINTED  
TO SUB-COMMITTEE**

Dean Sealock of the Teacher College and chairman of a general research committee of the Nebraska State Teachers association has appointed Prof. Roy E. Cochran chairman of a sub-committee on "Citizenship." Other members of the committee are Prof. Hattie Plum Williams, Prof. A. A. Reed, Principal Charles W. Taylor of the Teachers College high school, and J. Ed Fisher of Beatrice, Nebr.

This sub-committee is at present studying the matter of citizenship training by investigating the procedure of other states on the question and books and articles on the subject. It will spend several months in study of citizenship training in the public schools and will then develop and submit a report of its findings for the use of state school authorities and teachers. This report is intended to answer the question, How can subjects be taught in the public school so that good citizenship can be developed? It will involve such matters as teacher training, subject matter, and text books. The teaching of foreign born and native born citizens will also be considered.

The committee is co-operating with the state and county Americanization committee of the Nebraska State Bar association, the Masonic Service association, the state department of the American Legion, and other similar agencies.
