### Offer Real Estate Courses for Bizads

(University News Service) Two new courses in land economics and principles of real estate practice, designed for the special training of students intending to enter the real estate business, are announced for the coming year by the College of Business Administration of the University of Nebraska.

Such students will follow the regular four year course in business administration, giving special attention to economic geography, soils, investments, insurance, accounting, advertising, salesmanship, business law, rural economics, mechanical drawing, architectural composition and design, and various other courses in the College of Agriculture and Engineering.
