DOPE UPSET IN HIGH SCHOOL CAGE CIRCLES

Creighton Prep Forces Lincoln to Take Short End of 26 to 10 Count.
The defeat of Lincoln high school at the hands of Creighton Prep, 26 to 10, and Arlingtons defeat of Fremont 31 to 19, featured the games in high school basketball last week. Fremont, who had previously administered a defeat to Creighton Prep, fell victim to the fast playing of the Arlington five at the Midland College tournament at Fremont.

Chapell high school won the class A trophy in the Chadron Normal tournament, defeating Sidney in the finals 8 to 7. Grand Island won from Central City in the Class A finals of the class B honors, 22 to 18.

Dunbar defeated Nebraska City in a close game, 17 to 15 to decide the Class A finals of the tri-state tournament held at Peru Normal. Norfolk, conquerors of the fast Fremont team, and undefeated in their section of the state had little difficulty in winning the Wayne Normal tournament defeating Scribner 30 to 18 in the finals of class A. Carrol won from Ponca, 12 to 6, in class B.

Geneva sprung into the limelight by forcing the Lincoln cagers to extend themselves to complete a 32 to 28 win over them. University Place won a pair of games defeating Havelock 14 to 13, and Beatrice 12 to 11.

Omaha Tech continued her winning streak taking an 18 to 15 game from Central. In the western part of the state Mitchell and Sidney won their week end games and Broken Bow defeated Calloway, 72 to 20, making the fourteenth win for the Custer county quintet.

The York team coached by Ernie Hubka, a former Nebraskan Player, won handily from Wayne 24 to 12, but lost to Fremont 26 to 10. Sutton won a close game from Geneva 11 to 9.

The majority of the high school teams will close their season this week and plan for the State tournament to be held March 6, 7, and 8. So far the list of entries that has been received is nearly as great as last years, and it is expected to contain a larger number than ever before after all entries have been listed. Classification of the teams will take place February 29.
