in one pound as a start. The business grew so that now they do millions of dollars of business annually.

Mr. Eddy declared it was time for the American farmer to change the situation in America by taking up co-operative marketing. At present a few own the greatest part of the wealth and control prices.

Questions Ford's Rights.

While he stated that Henry Ford was a benefit to the American people by inventions and that he was very friendly to labor, yet he asked if it was right that Ford should make \$500,000 a day, while a million people in some foreign country have to work a day to make the same amount.

He denounced the moneyed interests in America at the present time and said that their control over the farmers and common people is more evident here than in any other country. Co-operation is the cure for this evil. Co-operation of the farmers in the marketing of their products is perhaps the biggest need. Co-operation in politics, in labor, and in demanding enforcement of the laws which do not permit graft in business and cover criminals who have money to defend themselves is needed.




