plunged for another yard. Another drive by Rhodes gained ten yards but he fumbled and K. U. recovered on her 40-yard line. Hodges recovered the ball.
 Mullins was injured and Kansas took out time. Hart failed to gain on an end run. Zuber fumbled a pass from center and was thrown for two yard loss. Burt failed to gain and was forced out of bounds. Zuber's punt rolled forty yards. Nebraska's ball on her own 20-yard line.

Robertson Scores.

Rhodes failed to gain on line plunge and forced out of bounds. Rhodes drove around Jayhawker's left end for six yards. On a fake punt formation Myers plunged through for three yards. Bloodgood punted forty yards and Hodges fumbled the punt and Robertson recovered the punt and ran thirty yards for a touchdown. A Mandery place-kicked the extra point.
 Robertson broke loose from two tacklers and ran for a touchdown.
 Score: Nebraska, 7; Kansas, 0.
 Burt kicked off thirty-five yards. Robertson returning thirteen yards to Nebraska's 25-yard line. Bloodgood made six yards around Jayhawker's right end. On a fake buck, Bloodgood plunged through for seven yards and a first down. Nebraska's ball on her own 41-yard line. Rhodes hit the line for four yards. Another plunge by Rhodes was good for six yards and a first down. Nebraska's ball on K. U.'s 48-yard line.

Collins Scores.

Rhodes plunged for three yards but Nebraska was penalized fifteen yards. Ball on Nebraska's 39-yard line. Rhodes shot a forward pass to Collins for twenty-five yards who ran forty yards to a touchdown. A Mandery place-kicked the extra point.
 Score: Nebraska, 14; Kansas, 0.
 The play was a fake end run. Rhodes whirled and threw the ball to Collins, who took it behind the K. U. safety man, and was tackled behind the goal.
 Burt kicked off fifty yards to a touchback. Nebraska's ball on her own 20-yard line. Bloodgood ran from punt formation seven yards through the K. U. left side. A Mandery plunged for five yards and a first down. On a split buck Myers plunged for five yards but play was called back and Nebraska penalized five yards for offside. Bloodgood faked a punt and Myers plunged for three yards.
 A forward pass by Bloodgood to Collins was incomplete. Kansas was penalized five yards for offside, and it is first down for Nebraska. The ball is on Nebraska's 37-yard line. Rhodes ran the right side of the Kansas line for five yards. H. Baker goes in for Sanborn for Kansas. On a tackle around play, Ed Weir made three yards. Rhodes plunged three yards and made it a first down. On a fake off tackle smash, Bloodgood made four yards around K. U.'s left end. The ball is in the middle of the field. Myers hit center for two yards. Time is up for third quarter with Nebraska in possession of the ball on Kansas' 48-yard line, third down and four yards to go.
 Score: Nebraska, 14; Kansas, 0.
Fourth Quarter.
 A forward pass from Bloodgood to Collins was incomplete. Bloodgood punted thirty yards to Hart, who returned five yards. Isset goes in for Hart for K. U. K. U.'s ball on her own 28-yard line: Burt hit the line for three yards. Isset tried Nebraska's right end for three yards. A forward pass, Zuber to Isset, was incomplete. Zuber punted fifteen yards out of bounds. Nebraska's ball on Kansas 41-yard line.
 J. Anderson substituted for Isset for Kansas in the backfield. Rhodes drove over K. U.'s right guard for three yards. A Mandery (Continued on Page Four.)
