Rhodes plunged three yards through the right side of K. U.'s line. A. Mandery drove over K. U.'s right tackle for three yards. Myers plunged two yards through center. Swope was substituted for Mullins in the Kansas line.

The ball was on K. U.'s 23-yard line, two yards to go on the fourth down. Bloodgood tried center but failed to gain. It was Kansas' ball on her own 23-yard line. Lindley substitutes for J. Anderson in the Kansas backfield. Zuber ran from punt formation and made thirteen yards around Nebraska's right end. Scholz substituted for Captain Weir for Nebraska.

20-yard Pass Successful.

Lindley tried the line but failed to gain. Pospisil substituted for Hubka. Zuber passed to Hodges for twenty yards. Kansas has the ball on Nebraska's 47-yard line. R. Mandery for Robertson. Locke for A. Mandery. Zuber forward passed to Hodges for eight yards. Ball on Nebraska's 4-yard line.

Another pass, Zuber to Hodges, was incomplete. Rhodes grounded the ball.

Hodges squirmed through center for three yards and a first down. A pass from Zuber was incomplete. On a fake play Haley ran Nebraska's right end for eighteen yards. The ball was on Nebraska's 18-yard line. A forward pass by Zuber was grounded by Collins.

Starr goes in for Lindley for K. U. Another pass by Zuber was incomplete.

A pass, Zuber to Hodges gained four yards. It was the fourth down and six yards to go.

The ball is on Nebraska's 14-yard line.

Zuber's forward pass to Starr, who caught the ball in the corner of the field was good for fourteen yards and a touchdown.

Burt place-kicked the extra point yards and a touchdown.

Burt kicked off fifty yards, Locke fumbled but returned for an eight-yard gain. The ball was on Nebraska's 9-yard line.
