Radio-correspondence Course in Business English to Be Offered

An innovation in education—extension service by the University of Nebraska is the Extension Division's combination radio-correspondence course in business English to be given for University credit by Prof. Maurice Wesen of the College of Business Administration. Professor Wesen is to broadcast his regular class lectures every Thursday, starting the first week in December, about 7 o'clock, from the University radio station, WFAV. Persons who wish to take the course for credit will register through the Extension Division and will receive announcements, assignments, and examinations through the mail, Prof. A. A. Reed, director of the division, states.

While the radio is used at Columbia University in connection with correspondence courses for credit and at Chicago University for courses without credit, its use in this immediate territory is a new thing. The course in business English consists of a study of words, including spelling, pronunciation, and use; exercises in the construction of correct and effective sentences; lessons in practical punctuation; and practice in paragraph development—all in connection with their use in business letters. Various types of letters considered will include collection, adjustment, sales, complaint, credit, application, recommendation and reference. Three lessons are given on sales letters—methods of conviction and persuasion and of handling special cases.
