

Sigma Xi Holds Open Meeting November 19

The Nebraska chapter of Sigma Xi, national honorary scientific society, will hold an open meeting November 19, at which mechanical problems will be discussed. Deon O. J. Ferguson of the College of Engineering will speak on the objectives of the engineering experiment station; Prof. M. I. Evinger will discuss various projects of the department; and Prof. W. L. DeBaufre will discuss the work of the United States Bureau of Mines.

Bengtson Contributes Articles to Annals

Prof. N. A. Bengtson of the department of geography contributed one of the three leading articles in a recent number of the Annals of the Association of American Geographers on "Some Essential Features of the Geography of the Santa Elena Peninsula, Ecuador." The article discusses some of the major physiographic features and their principal influences on the industries of the peninsula.

Weaver of the department of botany will attend the national convention of the American Association for the Advancement of Science and of the Botanical Society of America at Washington, D. C., in the holidays. Dr. Pool has been nominated for the vice-presidency of the Botanical Society of America. Dr. Weaver will present a paper on the invitation program.

Joseph G. Knapp, '22 (Business Administration), A. M. '23, research fellow at the Food Research Institute of Stanford University, is making a study for his doctor's degree of cooperative arrangements for the marketing of wheat in the United States since 1918.


