went blind. His sight returned in a short time and he finished the race. The four-and-a-half-mile course was run in twenty-two minutes.

In a game replete with spectacular runs, Nebraska triumphed over Illinois Thanksgiving day 16 to 10. Quarterback Bender got the first touchdown, making an eighty-yard run from a fake punt formation.

At a banquet held in the Lindell, Coach Booth was presented with a handsome loving cup in recognition of his work for the men of Nebraska.
