The missionary began his work in 1899. He and Mrs. Dye went to the tropical regions of Bolenge, in Belgian Congo, when the climate was at its most unhealthful point, and when the place was inhabited with canni-

Hardships and dangers filled the first years when Dr. Dye was the only doctor within a thousand miles of the Congo river. The medical science which he practiced was a great factor in the abolishment of the old witch doctors and witchery.

Dr. Dye was compelled to leave the work soon after 1907, when he was stricken with an attack of sleeping sickness. It was this sickness which led him to fight the disease, which was prevalent among the natives to a great extent.

The mission steamer "Oregon" which was built so that natives inland on the Congo river could be reached by missionaries, was built after Dr. Dye led a subscription drive for the money necessary to outfit


