The companies visited Tuesday furnished transportation to the group by the provision of buses.
Wednesday at 8 o'clock H. S. Shows, results engineer, directed the men through the Kansas City Railway Company's Second and Grand power station. Mr. Shows has reduced considerably the cost of operation to his company.
The Kansas City Power and Light Company's northeast power station, Warner and Missouri River, were next visited. Here the engineering students were addressed by Chief Electrical Engineer R. L. Friable and Chief Combustion Engineer, McDonald. They were the guest of the company at lunch.

The Armour and Company Packing Plants, Armour station, Kansas City, Kansas, was the first place of Thursday's visits. Here the details of interest to students were stressed, which gave the men a view of the plant which are not open to regular visitors. Lunch, including the famous "ham what am," was served by the Armour Company.
Afternoon visits were made at the Kansas City Structural Steel Company, 21st and Metropolitan Avenue, and, in the case of chemical engineering students, to the Peet Brothers Company, soap manufacturers, Kansas City, Kansas.

ADD EDUCATIONAL REFORMS.
The Lantern proposes an innovation in graduations. It is that the gigantic, monstrous, enormous, elephantine, commencements now practiced at this University be discontinued, and that for them be substituted departmental commencements.
For example, there will be say twenty-five graduates of the department of journalism this spring. These twenty-five must join in with 1200 from every other department of instruction in the University. They must go a baccalaureate sermon with the young army, and they must listen to a commencement address with the army.
The trouble with these commencement addresses is that the speaker feels the need of bringing into his address something of interest to every graduate. The result is a mass of advice to engineers and farmers, to pharmacists and lawyers.
And the awarding of diplomas on such a wholesale scale takes away from the ceremony all that is personal. The man who hands the sheepskins to the eager seniors does not know the seniors. It is a formal gesture for him.
Our plan provides for a simple graduation, and one which does not

require graduates to go to a rehearsal that they may find their correct place in line to be in position when their diploma comes up. Our plan does away with wandering commencement addresses. A specialist in journalism would speak to us; a registered pharmacist would speak to the pharmacists, and all of us would go away with something of interest to us in our minds.
And our style of commencement would eliminate the necessity of receiving diplomas from someone who did not know us. We would take ours from the head of our department. We have worked with him these years. There would be something personal about it, and we might feel some sentiment. As things stand, a senior feels like a part in a great automobile assembling plant.—Ohio State Lantern.
