The University of Nebraska football machine saw action in a regular game against the freshmen Saturday afternoon. The freshmen displayed an unusually strong defense and the Varsity was forced to extend itself to win 14 to 0. Coach Beary used about thirty men during the contest, starting the second half with an entirely new team. It is quite evident by the showing made by all those getting into the Varsity line-up that Nebraska will be represented by at least three good teams this year. Both backfield and line material is to be had in abundance.

During the game several members of the Varsity squad displayed real football ability. Howell and Pressnell in the starting line-up were especially good at ground gaining through the line. These two men can alternate either at full or half-back and both can handle these positions to a nicety.

Dalley, Nebraska's speed merchant, did most of the ground gaining during the second half. He picked his holes with good judgment and ran good interference. Marrow, who took Dalley's place at half, turned in the best run of the day when he carried the ball through the Fresh line for nearly twenty yards. Lindell, who played at quarter during the second half, handled the team in good style and made some nice gains through the line. He is sure on catching punts and made nice returns on two.

The freshmen had one advantage during the game and that was in the kicking department. "Chief" Elkins, Oklahoma Indian, playing quarter for the fresh, got off some beautiful kicks, and his yardage on several was fifty yards or better. Farley, fullback, Richards, tackle, and Toms, end, were other freshmen whose playing was outstanding.

The game yesterday gave Coach Beary and his assistants a good idea of how the men looked under fire, especially, as the opposition given by the freshmen was of the first class variety. It is doubtful that some of the teams which Nebraska meets this year could have offered a stronger defense.

After yesterday's game, our selection of the starting backfield in the Drake game next Saturday would be Howell at full, with Brown and Dalley at halves. The quarterback position as yet is much of a gamble. Bronson, Stephens and Lindell are all showing up well. Bronson will probably get the assignment because of his experience.

Word comes from Drake that Coach Selem and his lieutenant, "Bill" Becker, are planning some surprises for the opening game. It will be remembered that Drake upset Nebraska's apple-cart last year, but we doubt if same will happen again. We believe that Coach Beary also has some surprises up his sleeve.



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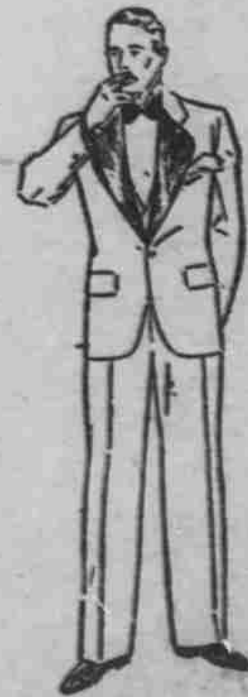
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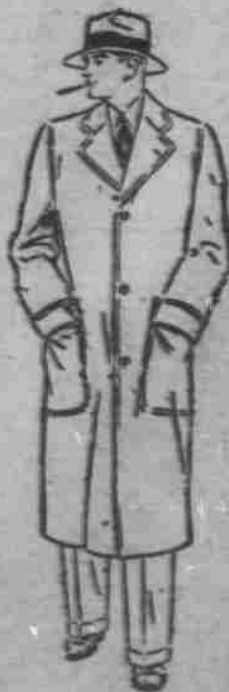
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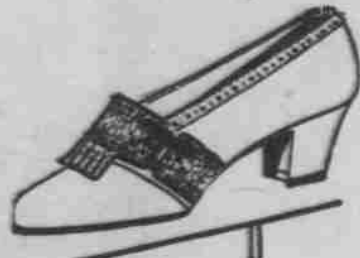
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
