

## HUSKERS WORK OUT DEFENSE

### Coach Black Drills Two Squads On Five Man Defense Tactics

Coach Black sent his first two teams through a lengthy scrimmage yesterday as he watched the results of the individual instruction and drill on five-man defense stressed during the past week. Smoother team-work and more accurate basket shooting was noticeable in the work-out.

The first squad, which was composed of lettermen, had Captain Smaha and Klepser as forwards, Elliot at center and Anderson and Gerelick as guards. The quintet which formed the opposition had Brown and Othmer at the forwards, Page at center, and Morrison and Holm at the guards.

The defense work of Morrison and Holm was a feature of the scrimmage. They held down the opposing forwards sufficiently to enable the second team to run up a 20-to-16 score on the lettermen. Othmer was high point man of the two groups.

Wonderful possibilities offer themselves for men out for the grappling

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team this year. Only two lettermen have returned from last year's squad and chances for newcomers to make the team are excellent.

We note with interest that the University of Wisconsin basketball team is to drop the five man defense. For years this style of play has been linked with the short passing game of the Badgers. Instead of using the spread formation on the court the Wisconsin quintet will use the man to man style of defense, already used by the majority of Big Ten teams.

The passing of the five man defense from Wisconsin, a school long converted to this style of play, means but one thing. The speeding up of the cage game. For many years the five man defense has been the object of much criticism. The game has been slowed up and stalling has become an art under the domination of this method of court play. For the sake of athletics we are glad to see the five man defense go into the discard along with the mass formations of football.

## Now You Tell One

A June bride asked her husband to copy a recipe over the radio one morning. He got two stations at once. One was broadcasting morning exercises. The result was:

Hands on hips, place one cup of flour on shoulders, raise knees and depress toes and wash thoroughly in 1-2 cup of milk. 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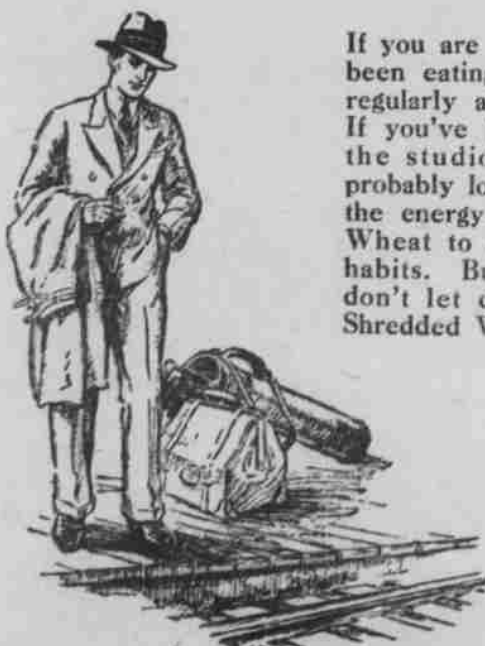
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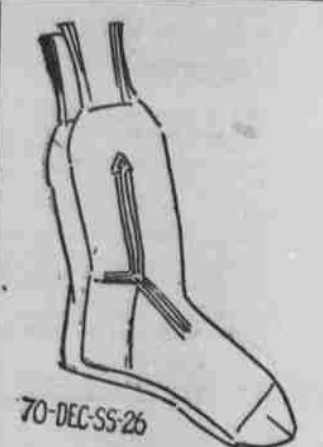
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
