What to Eat  
All questions of vitamins, calories, proteins, carbohydrates, and fats that you may consider or disregard in your eating, are left for your own determination. Manager Harris insists on buying only the best of food products, on keeping them clean, on having them cooked properly, and served quickly and courteously; but he does not try to tell you what you should or should not eat.  
That is a question for you or your physician to decide.  
If all people ate exactly the same food and in about the same quantities, keeping a restaurant would be as standardized as selling postage stamps. But the old saying, "What is one man's meat is another's poison," is as true today as when first said. And this keeps the manager constantly on the lookout for a great variety of food, so that you may make your choice according to your desires or "doctor's orders."  
As a general rule, if your appetite is normal, your likes and dislikes will be your best guide. So one of Manager Harris' slogans is, "Food Cooked as You Like It."  
The Central Cafe's daily mimeographed menu usually contains about 72 items of food to be served, and is issued twice each day. It covers, Soups, Fish, Entrees, Roasts, Cold Meats, Relishes, Salads, and Desserts.  
The regular printed menu card on one side has about 177 items of food and drink, covering Relishes, Soup to Order, Oysters in Season, Steaks and Chops, Eggs and Omelettes, Vegetables, Sandwiches, Cheese, Preserved and Fresh Fruits in Season, Salads, French Pastries and Home Made Pies; Coffee, Tea, Chocolate, etc.  
On the reverse of this card are listed eight combination Breakfasts and some 39 items of food from which to choose your a la Carte Breakfast.
