

HUSKERS ENTER ILLINOIS RELAYS

Eight Members of Track Squad Leave This Afternoon For Urbana Meet

KAGS HERE NEXT WEEK

Eight Cornhusker track men, Coach Henry F. Schulte, and "Doc" McLean, versatile trainer, will leave on the Rock Island at 1:19 this afternoon for Urbana and the annual Illinois Relays. The squad was reduced on account of the scheduling of an indoor dual meet here next week with Kansas State Agricultural College.

Both the Illinois Relays and the dual meet here with the Kaggies will be letter meets, the first of the 1927 season. Points made in the meet with the Nebraska college conference winners and in the K. C. A. C. meets did not count towards letters.

Meet Stiff Competition

Captain Bobby Stephens, Krause, Hurd, Dailey, Davenport, Tappan, Johnson, and Wirsig will be the Nebraska contestants at Illinois. Captain Stephens will run in the 75-yard dash and compete in the broad jump. Hurd will leave the shot, Krause will run in both 75-yard high and low hurdles. He will have to compete with some of the outstanding hurdlers of the country Saturday. Wirsig, rapidly recovering from the tonsillitis which kept him out of the opening meets of the season, will compete for the first time this season. He will face a string of crack valley and Big Ten pole vaulters.

Glen Johnson is scheduled to take a whack at the 1000 meter run Saturday. Frank Dailey will run the 300 yards. Both will double back in the mile relay with Davenport and Tappan, completing the team. Dailey replaces Campbell, who ran in the mile relay at Kansas City, on account of the necessity of cutting down the size of the squad.

Return Saturday Evening

The Huskers will return late Saturday evening with a few days of hard work before them before they face the Kaggies on the stadium indoor track the latter part of the week. The second tri-color meet of the season is scheduled for Monday afternoon on the indoor track. Following the Illinois meet, the dual meet with Kansas State and the Missouri Valley Indoor at Des Moines March 11 and 12 will bring the indoor season to a close.
