as a brilliant speaker, thinker, scholar, lawyer, and a broad-minded man of affairs. What he will have to say on the subject of "The building of a great University" will be well worth the attention of not only the alumni but of the people of the entire state. It is felt.

Cornhusker alumni and other friends of Bracelin who knew him while he was a student in the university will remember him as a champion debater. Members of the faculty will remember him as a very thorough student. The late Professor M. M. Fogg often referred to him as one of the keenest speakers and debaters he had ever known.
Harold Holtz, secretary of the alumni association, upon receiving Bracelin's acceptance, said, "That is the best news we have had in many a day. Bracelin is an outstanding speaker, a rare scholar, and one of the nation's greatest lawyers. His coming will please the alumni of the university."

FIRST TRACK MEET HELD IN GRETE

"Red" Layton, "Mud" Gardner, and Captain Ed Allen running the medley relay race captured first honors for the Cornhusker school.
The longest trip of the season came on March 23, when Coach Schulte took his tracksters to the coast to meet the strong California Bears, holder of the 1921 and 1922 intercollegiate titles. The first lap of the Cornhusker itinerary brought the

Nebraska team to Kansas City for the Missouri Valley indoor meet, where they won second place. One world's record was tied by Lloyd, Husker sprinter, when he stepped off the 50-yard dash in five and two-fifths seconds, with Noble, of Nebraska, finishing a close second. Captain "Ed" Allen set a new valley record for the mile and "Mud" Gardner smashed his own record in the 880-yard run.
On April 7 Nebraska went up against the California Bears and were defeated 75 to 56. Inability to score in the field events caused the downfall of Schulte's track team. In the second meet after the return from the coast, Nebraska piled up a score of 83 to 48 on the Kansas team in a dual meet. Ten firsts and a tie for an eleventh was the record in the Kansas-Nebraska meet. Then the last dual meet of the season with the Haskell Indians resulted in a decisive win for Nebraska.

The cross country team was Paul Zimmerman, Hyde, Jimmie Lewis, Jacob Schultz, and Ed Dickson.


