Four State Hi Marks Topple in Track Meet

(Continued from Page 1) elin. Fuller of North Loup ran true to form, raising the 12-pound shot put mark to forty-nine feet, bettering the old record by five inches made last year by White, of Winnebago. White placed second in the event.

Payne of Beaver City, competing in Group II took a big bite out of the discus record, hurling the platter for a distance of 130 feet, 9 inches, raising the old mark nearly four feet held by Creighton of Gothenburg. Reynolds of Minatare was credited with the fourth new mark when he hurled the javelin 169 feet, 8 1/2 inches.

Lambert followed his first sprint performance with a nearly record breaking act for the 220 yard dash, tying Easter's mark of 22 seconds for the furlong. Mathis of Tecumseh furnished the last record tying feat when he stepped over the low hurdles to tie "Timber" Trumble's time of 25.6 seconds.

Group I honors went to Randolph high school with a total of 21-2 points. Fairfield was second with eighteen and North Loup third with

15 1-2 counters. The two man team of North Loup came through in great shape, Fuller winning both the shot and discus events in his class while Schaffner picked up several points in the hurdles.

Tecumseh Wins Tecumseh had easy going in Group II walking off with twenty-eight points a lead of ten and a half over Nelson high, their closest rival. The battle for third place was a hot affair with Crete, Gothenburg and Cambridge finishing in the ordered named.

Grand Island took Group III honors with a total thirty-one and a fourth points scoring heavy in the low hurdles and counting in practically every event, Lambert's flashy work in the sprints with Panek's victory in the high hurdle event in Group III scored a big share of Kearney's points and brought them the second place banner. Omaha Tech was third.

Tecumseh high shared the majority of the spot light, three of their team being individual event champions. Casford in the half-mile, Brillhart in the broad jump and Mathis in the low hurdles were credited with the best marks in these events, while their mark of 1:33.9 was the best in the relay. Petz of Nelson furnished the big surprise of the day in the finals of the Group II high hurdles when he nosed out Trumble of Cambridge to win the individual medal. Trumble clicked the last hurdle slowing him up enough for Petz to pass him and win by inches. Ransell of Lexington high had the best time in the mile when he beat Group III milers to win in 4:49.2.
