back to infancy and are caused by some thwarted impulse. Today people are recognizing the seriousness of speech difficulty which sometimes makes the child feel inferior and consequently he does not make the proper social adjustment. The tremendous price to be paid in later life is too serious to be ignored.

The aim of the course is to help the teacher handle nervous difficulties of speech and phonetic disorders. These children will be found to be relaxed on couches or playing with blocks with the attention directed from the mechanism of speech but to what they are saying.
