With the addition of this game the schedule is now complete and Nebraska will encounter some difficulty when on the following Saturday the team will go to Syracuse, return home for Pittsburgh, and then go to Columbia for the Missouri tussle. The Kansas Jayhawkers will play Nebraska the following Saturday in Lincoln.
