

REGISTRATION IS SET FOR JANUARY 14-19

Publication of Programs Has Been Delayed by Sickness

January 14, one week after the end of the Christmas recess, will open the week of second semester registration for resident students. Registrations will close Saturday noon, Jan. 19, the registrar's office announced yesterday.

No definite date has yet been set for the issuance of the second semester programs. The publication has been delayed by sickness which has made it impossible for the printers to finish the work.

Special attention is called to the fact that the registration period from January 14 to 19 is for students who have been attending the university the first semester. Any new students, or students who have previously attended the university but who have not attended the first semester, will register on February 1.

Announcement will be made after Christmas recess of the date when students may obtain programs and credit books. New courses to be offered will also be announced.

DEAN INVESTIGATES FRATERNITY PRANKS

Christmas Tree Episode May Lead to Some Action By Officials

Prosecution was threatened for the men that took a Christmas tree from the furniture store last Friday night owned by Bruce W. Shurtleff, 1235 K street. The tree was discovered at the Delta Chi fraternity house, 1421 H street.

"This business of fraternity men stealing Christmas trees for a prank must stop," Mr. Shurtleff had said. "Dean Thompson is planning to put an end to all such pranks. I will wait and see what is done before I take action." A \$100 reward was offered for the information as to who had taken the tree.

The tree was traced by needles and branches that had been broken off as it was taken away. A number of prominent alumni and school authorities have taken up the problem and are making an investigation in order to see what can be done.

This game closed the season for the Betas in which they have not had a touch goal scored against them, the only points being made by foul throws.

In a preliminary game for third place in the final rating, the Phi Kappa Alpha beat Phi Gamma Delta, 11 to 8. A queer thing about this game was the fact that Mocker of Phi Kappa Alpha scored all of his teams points and Kenagy of the Phi Gams did the same thing for his team.

Students at Ohio State university are to make tests to determine the effect of the wind on tall buildings, using the 555-foot American Insurance Union candel as a laboratory.

"The result of his study may have a direct bearing on the future design of tall buildings to resist high winds," said Professor Clyde T. Morris of the department of civil engineering.

The American Institute of Steel Construction and the United States weather bureau are co-operating in the undertaking.
