

SECOND TERM ELECTIONS WILL BE ON TUESDAY

Student Council Schedules Date For Selection of New Officers

ELECT IVY DAY ORATOR All Class Office Aspirants Must Fill University Requirements

Second semester elections will be held on Tuesday, February 19, Edward Larson, president of the Student Council, announced Saturday.

Candidates for offices may make filings in the Student Activities office next week. All filings must be in by 5 o'clock Friday afternoon.

The president of the freshman, sophomore, junior and senior classes and the Ivy Day orator will be chosen at the election.

Amendments Voted On. The two amendments to the constitution of the Student Council regarding student elections, passed Jan. 19 and later accepted at a mass meeting, will be voted on at the election Feb. 19 and will require a majority vote for passage.

Article IV. No vote shall be solicited at the polls or in the building during election day. No money shall be spent on behalf of any candidate nor shall any printed mimeograph, typed or otherwise published or written be printed, except the impartial announcement of the candidates in the press.

Article V. Each candidate must file his or her own name in the Student Activities office not later than 5 p. m. on the Friday prior to the day of the election.
