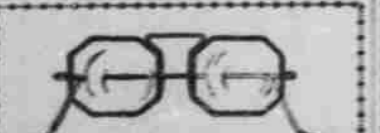
The young man was taken to the hospital shortly after the scuffle, and examination revealed the fact that he was suffering from severe lacerations.

Speaking of stadiums, the question is still more or less up in the air. "What will Coach 'Choppy' Rhodes use this spring for a baseball diamond?"

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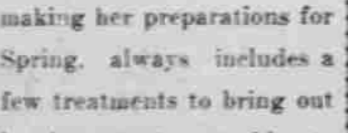
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Museum Interest Grows Throughout Society, Declares Curator Collins

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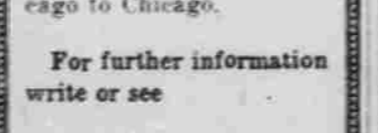
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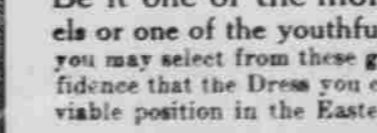
