The Tuesday of Holy week is known as a day of conflict. Days of conflict were frequent in public ministry of Jesus. His ministry began with forty days of inper conflict in the wilderness. was there that Jesus made his irocable choice of an inner, spiritual, instead of the material, the popular, the superficial."

Jesus Faced Struggle

The outward conflict that faced lesus on the last day of his public ministry was against the very same elements, personified in the Pharsees and the scribes, according to Mr. Hayes. These Pharisces per-formed good deeds so that they might be seen by men. Their emphasis was all on the outward show. inner reality had vanished Their hostility to Jesus was the inevitable result of two opposing atlitudes toward life. One sought the approval of man, and the other sought the approval of God.

This is not altogether an ancient sin, this desire for outward show and not for inward real-There are students who value grades, however secured, bove a real grasp of the subjects. There are business men who prefer driving the finest cars available to keeping their credit good."

The call of these days of Holy week to each one of us is a call to bring all areas of our life under the Christ, that we may share with Him that hatred of all that is hypocritical and unreal.
