Chancellor Burnett Explains Ph.D. Degree Arrangements at University

One of a series of weekly articles written by Chancellor E. A. Burnett concerning the Ph. D. situation has recently been issued. The chancellor, in his capacity as director of the University, and clears up certain misunderstandings which exist in the public mind.

(By Chancellor E. A. Burnett) If one were to search the University over for the one question that has aroused the most discussion within the faculty and considerable discussion outside, that question would undoubtedly turn out to be the "Ph. D." question.

In the first place, there are no such regulations provided and enforced by the Board of Regents of the University in choosing and recommending prospective members of the faculties who have the right to prefer men and women with a doctor's philosophy degree.

University Wants Leaders That is really all there is to it. The University naturally insists on a high degree of leadership in the subject a man proposes to teach.

Chancellor Urges Study But I think that generally a young man or woman who expects to remain in University work should plan for such a degree on its equivalent because in the long run it opens better positions to him.

The "three-year rule" as someone has called it, has no official basis. Many instructors have been retained beyond that period. But I feel that a department chairman who sees no possible chance of promotion for a prospective young member of the faculty...

Members of the department of chemistry say that recently there has been a much greater demand on the part of the industries for well trained chemists than ever before.

Chemists Get Industrial Jobs In Many Places

Graduating chemists have had no trouble in securing positions. Among these is E. A. Durban, receiving his Ph. D. in June, who has accepted a position in the research laboratory of the Eastman Kodak company at Rochester, New York.

Edwin L. Mattison, who gets his Ph. D. this summer, will be connected with the E. I. duPont de Nemours & Co. at Wilmington, Delaware. He also will be in the research department of the B. F. Goodrich company of Akron, Ohio.

Omar Snyder goes to Buffalo, New York, to work for the DuPont rayon company after he receives his B. Sc. in chemical engineering. Several graduates will pursue their studies further at other universities.

Carl C. Jensen, who receives his master's degree this summer, has been appointed to a fellowship in Purdue university at Lafayette, Indiana.

Howard M. Parmelee, also taking his master's degree this summer, has received a fellowship at Northwestern University at Evanston, Illinois. The University of Illinois has appointed Paul R. Schildneck, who gets his master's degree at the same time, to a fellowship in chemistry.

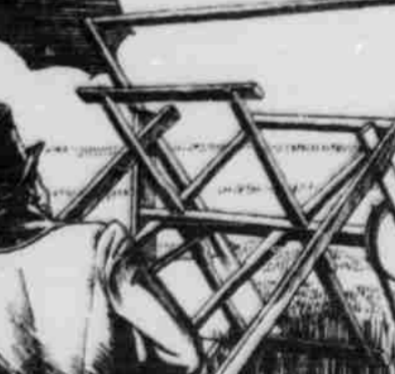
