Actual competition extends over two days, but Friday is taken up by high school competition, with five events in the college and university decathlon scheduled for the afternoon...

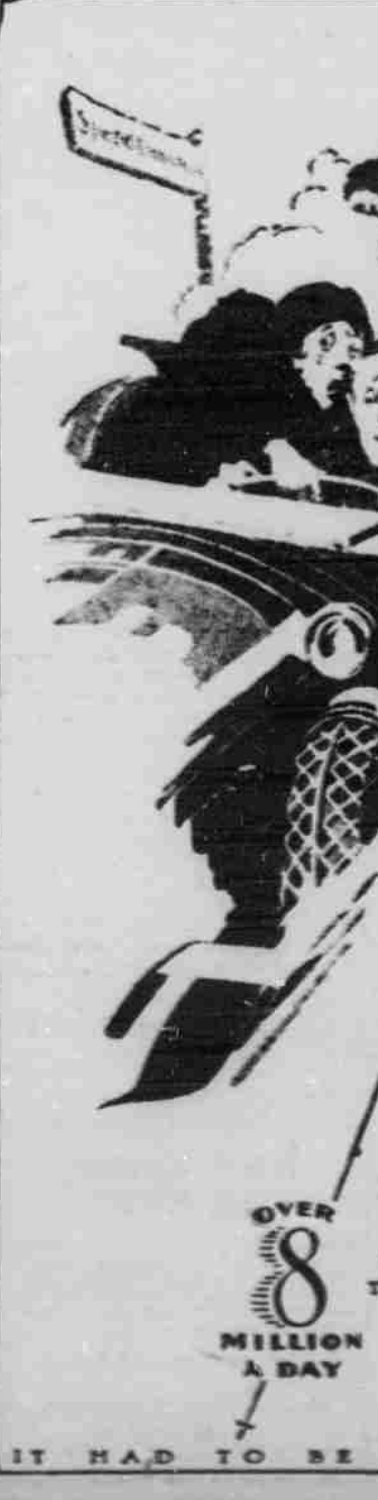
Coeds Sponsor Tennis Playing Via Sea Tactics
