

NEBRASKA WINS OVER MYTHICAL SYRACUSE TEAM

Hokuf Intercepts Pass and Races Fifty Yards for Lone Touchdown

'REDS' HOLD ADVANTAGE

Practice Game Shows Up Ability of Teams on Slippery Field

Nebraska won out over "Syracuse" Wednesday afternoon when Steve Hokuf intercepted a yellow shirt pass in the middle of the field and raced 50 yards for a touchdown in a spring training practice game. Both teams played fair football although the speed was cut down by a slippery field and completed passes were few and far between.

The Reds held the advantage throughout the game, being within the Orange 35-yard line on several occasions and narrowly missing another touchdown when a pass, long by Scherzinger, was incomplete across the goal line. The Orange team took the ball but failed to gain and the game ended with the ball in possession of the Reds.

First half was nip and tuck with the main part of both periods being played in Orange territory. Long and Scherzinger of the Red team plunged and skirted the ends for substantial gains. Long being especially effective on the slippery field. He also flipped several passes which went for good gains but the slippery field and insecure footing made passing almost useless. Scherzinger played a nice defensive game and rammed the line several good gains. The Red team, Watkins, ends on the Red team, played a nice game, Hokuf intercepting the pass and making the touchdown that spelled victory for Nebraska.

Line Breaks Through

Marquie was bothered some on his passes and punts by the Red line. The line broke through time and again and downed him before he had time to get the ball off or rushed his attempts. The Red line was functioning the best it has all year and begins to show promise of developing into a real Nebraska line. Captain Farley played a good defensive game, although he failed to carry the ball very successfully.

The second half was a repetition of the first with the Reds carrying the fight into Orange territory. Both teams were a little more successful with their passes and the aerial game has shown considerable improvement and should help round out the Nebraska attack.

Rhea, center, and Hokuf, end, were two sophomores who showed up well in the practice game and should bid strong for a varsity berth next year.

The speaker is not one of Caesar's soldiers in a sequel to the well-known "We who are about to die salute you," although in truth he does wear a diminutive helmet, impressive breast plate, and a flashy red-lined cape, which, with his colorful hair, makes an interesting ensemble, completed by his cherry nose. His five tradesmen friends are at best a maudlin group with expressionless simplicity and imagination which would well countenance giving a "merry tragical comedy" before the duke, George Holt, in the last act of the production.
