### Eastern Fans Expect Fast, Flashy Style of Play in Intersectional Clash; Exceptionally Speedy Backfield to Start Against Nebraska.

The Cornhuskers and the Orange of Syracuse have met six times on the gridiron, each eleven coming out with three games each. The Orange this year is determined to avenge the two stinging defeats of the past two years at the hands of the mighty Cornhuskers at Lincoln.

Last year against Syracuse, Nebraska recovered a fumble on the very first play of the game and turned it into seven points on "Dutch" Witte's pass to Clair Sloan. Witte will not see very much service in the game this year due to an early season injury, but Clair Sloan, the Verdon flash, will be in the Husker backfield and ready for plenty of damage.

Two stone wall lines will meet in the Archibald stadium tomorrow when these two ancient rivals get together for one of the most outstanding football classics in the country this week. Syracuse expects more than 25,000 football fans to crowd into the stadium.
