Blue Print Comments on Many Types Of Architecture Sororities Exemplify

An article by Louise Westover dealing with the new type of sorority houses which have appeared on the campus in the course of the last five years appeared in the current issue of the Nebraska Blue Print.

The English type of architecture has also met with considerable favor. The Delta Delta Delta house follows English design, the Delta Zeta house is of the English manor type, and the Delta Gamma house is of English design with a feature of Spanish architecture in the high railed balcony incorporated in the design.

Greeks Are Slighted. Greek architecture has been slighted in sorority construction on the Nebraska campus. The Alpha Xi Delta house is the only one that can be classified as being of this type.

The Chi Omegas when building their new home favored the French style. The Pi Beta Phi house is what an architect would classify Gregorian while the Kappa Delta house is distinctly Gothic.

The Alpha Phi house features a first floor garden room with a railed balcony on the second. The main points of the Alpha Chi Omega house are its high rousing ceilings and the Cornhusker room which is decorated in scarlet and cream.

Thus is recorded the trend of the change from the stately old mansions which were formerly preferred in sorority houses to the modern structure which incorporates all of the characteristics of current architecture.
