

HUSKERS PREPARE FOR JAYHAWKERS

Clair Sloan Fails to Report for Practice Wednesday Due to Illness; Coaches Groom Art Perry To Fill In At Backfield Post

SCARLET HOLDS EDGE IN SCORING FOR SEASON

Coach Dana X. Bible wound up this week of broken up practice sessions last evening in preparation for the Homecoming classic on tap for Memorial stadium field Saturday with the University of Kansas Jayhawkers. Coach Bible's eleven was given a severe jolt Wednesday when Clair Sloan, triple-threat ace, failed to report for practice due to sickness. Coach Bible will replace Sloan in the Husker backfield by Art Perry, the Verdon ace he on the sick list by kickoff time Saturday.

The Cornhusker offense is set for the coming of the tribe from Lawrence and Thursday night saw the Husker pigskin mentor putting

scored 27 points to 25 for the opponents. Saturday's game with Kansas will find the scarlet evenly matched in weight and speed with the men of Bill Hargiss. In backfield weight, Kansas will have a slight edge but with the insertion of Art Perry in the backfield, Nebraska will have one of the fastest set of backs in the conference.

Injuries Are Slight

Bible's combination to start against K. U., providing Clair Sloan is kept out of the lineup, will include Dutch Witte at quarterback, Marvin Paul and Red Young at the half posts and Art Perry at fullback. The injury list of the Huskers includes only two names, Lewandowski and Scherzinger are the two members of the squad to be claimed by the injury jinx for this game. Scherzinger may be able to go into the game but his injury received in the Syracuse game is still causing some trouble. His addition to the Nebraska backfield will add greatly to the scarlet passing attack.

Not since back in the dim dark dusty past has a Kansas line been able to match with a Cornhusker forward wall in man power but Saturday on Memorial field it will be different. In the line positions the Cornhuskers will be heavily outweighed for at center Coach

Bill Hargiss will have Pete Bausch, the center who tips the beams at a usual 215. First, Jayhawk guard, climbs on the scales at 205, while the other guard berth is held down by Logan, who weighs 185. The tackle on the Kansas forward wall are both over 200 pounds, which will outweigh the Huskers to a great extent. But the Cornhusker ends with Morgan and Housur will have the Jayhawkers in the shade in weight advantage.

Hargiss Has Scorers

If scoring ability in their past games will mean anything in the Nebraska game Saturday, Kansas will have great quantities of scorers in the backfield. In Lee Page,

Hargiss has the leading football scorer in the conference. Other leaders in the scoring column also will be present in the Jayhawk backfield. Frosty Cox, Kansas half, is one of the leading scorers as well as Jim Bausch, the 200-pound fullback.

Not since the fall of 1916 on the football field has a Jayhawk eleven defeated a team wearing the Scarlet and Cream, and the only game to give the Kansas eleven any satisfaction in the tie score of 1923 when K. U. helped

Nebraska dedicate their Memorial stadium. With this fact being impressed very strongly on the Lawry race team, Hargiss is gradually building his squad up to a high pitch for the annual Homecoming tilt here this week.

Kansas Is Confident

This week's practice down at Lawrence has greatly pleased the director of Kansas football and reports are that the Jayhawk eleven is clicking in machine-like perfection. Hargiss reported yesterday that the starting backfield

for Kansas will find Jim Bausch, 200 pounds, at fullback, Frosty Cox, 190 pounds, at half, Captain Lyman, 175 pounds, at the other half and Paul Fisher, 175 pounds, at quarterback.
