MAJORITY OF K. U. STUDENTS BELONG TO SOME CHURCH

LAWRENCE, Kan., Nov. 7.—Ninety per cent of the students at the University of Kansas are church members, or have a church preference, according to figures compiled by Registrar George O. Peater.

Of the 3521 students reporting some church connection, 1197 are Methodists, 730 are Presbyterians, and 455 are Christians, Congregationalists, Baptists and Catholics number more than 200 each and Episcopalians and Lutherans have more than 100. More than 25 denominations are on the campus.
