Gramlich Disparages Trend of Young Farmers Who Raise Only Show Stock.

The junior endeavor of the nation, declared Professor Gramlich, has been focused during recent years upon 4-H club work, the original purposes of which were the interesting of farm boys and girls in the proper care of animals as well as to attempt to create an interest among parents in the production of finished beets at a young age.

"How far," he asks, "have we strayed from the original purposes? In the first place, packers are complaining that 4-H calves are too heavy to suit their needs. Secondly, it must be admitted that baby beef work, as conducted today in most regions, holds the show and auction ring as its major goals.

"What are the after effects? I fear that we are developing some professionalism among our would-be innocent little amateurs. Just recently a grand champion steer which sold for approximately \$11 per pound produced an interesting study in the beef coolers. The carcass gave unmistakable evidence of a liberal use of the herdsman's sharp practice tools. I wonder if our committee on show ring ethics should not take a rather definite stand on this problem?"

In speaking of Turkish men of the present day, he said that the old fez which they formerly wore had been abolished by law, and that the men were gradually adopting American styles in hats and other apparel.

Mr. Nouman pointed out that the changes were affecting both young and old in his country. "Among the older people, the changes are only external," he said. "They adopt new dress and laws philosophically, but in their hearts still cherish the old order. The younger generation, on the other hand, are growing up amid new customs. They seem to take to them readily. Their actions are more similar to those of young people of the United States and of Europe than to young people of their own nation twenty-five years ago."
