

GREEK HARDWOOD TOURNAMENT SWINGS INTO PLAY SOON

Vogeler Pairs Fraternity Quintets for Class A' Hoop Race.

COMPETITION IS KEEN

Many Teams Enter Almost Intact from Games Last Season.

One of the greatest interfraternity basketball tournaments ever held in the University of Nebraska will get under way next week with six leagues in class A fighting for the supremacy of the court. Rudy Vogeler, director of all intramural athletics stated Thursday that the 1929-30 intramural program at Nebraska was by far the greatest program the university has ever outlined.

Every fraternity on the campus will compete in the cage tournament which is to get under way next Tuesday evening, with twelve games in class A scheduled for the opening night on the coliseum floor. Vogeler announced that to keep the wheels of the big tournament moving along in good shape that every fraternity entered in the tournament should play their games as per schedule, be on time and have their officials decided on two games are slated for each court every night.

"B" Will Start Later.

The class B tournament has not yet been completed in pairings but this is expected to get started as soon after the opening whistle of the class A tournament. Kappa Sigma, winners of the cage title last year are early season favorites to cop the title again this year although reports from various Greek letter camps are to the effect that the 1930 cage race is going to be a fast affair with plenty of competition. Alpha Sigma Phi, Phi Sigma Kappa, Sigma Alpha Epsilon and Delta Upsilon are all rated as strong favorites in the great 1930 race.

Practice has been going on for the past three weeks and the Greek letter teams are in top shape for the first going. Opening the season Tuesday night will be the Phi Psi and Sigma Nu game which is scheduled for court 2 at 7 o'clock. No advance dope has been sent out as to this game as both quintets seem to be dark horses in the cage race. Following this game on the same court at 7:25 will be the Phi Gam-Sig Chi game which will be another high light in the opening games.

D. U. Favored.

On court 3 Tuesday night the D. U. five will open up against the sigma Phi Sigma quintet. The boys from the D. U. house are rated as a strong club in the early season dope column and are doped to take an easy victory as a season starter while the Alpha Theta-Sigma Mu game is listed in the doubtful column as to the outcome.

Court 4 will see the champion Kappa Sig five pitted against the lawyers from the Phi Alpha Delt

house with the Phi Sigma and Alpha Sigma playing the opening game on the same court at 7 o'clock. In league five no games are scheduled for the opening night although on Wednesday, Dec. 11 three games are scheduled with Delta Chi meeting the Tau Kappa Epsilon five at 7 and Phi Kappa meeting Kappa Psi on floor 2 at 7:25. Delta Sigma Phi will meet the Farm House five on floor 4 at 7:25 in the last game in league five that night.

League four finds the Theta Chi quintet meeting the cagers from the Phi K. A. house on Tuesday night on floor 3 at 7 o'clock with the Alpha Tau Omega crew meeting the law students from the Delta Theta Phi house on floor 5 at 7:25 o'clock.

A complete slate of the fraternity standings and the scheduled games will be run in The Daily Nebraskan each day during the cage tourney with a dope bucket column predicting games published in advance of the tourney games.

TACKLE RICHARDS ACCEPTS BID TO PLAY ON COAST

Dick Hanley, Coach of All Star Eastern Team, Invites 'Big Ray.'

Nagurski, Brazil, Cannon, Welch, Consent to New Year's Contest.

Raymond "Big" Richards, All-Big Six tackle and one of the most outstanding line men in the country, will play in the annual east-west game at San Francisco on Jan. 1. Richards received an invitation from Dick Hanley, coach of Northwestern who is assisting in the coaching of the all-star east eleven, and has accepted to play with the eastern stars. Richards will join the eastern squad at Evanston where they will work out a few days before trekking across the country to the west coast. The scene of the annual battle.

Nebraska has had a representative on the all-star team from the east for a number of years and as the game grows to be a tradition so does the fact that Nebraska is always represented on the team. The game at San Francisco was played in December last year and two Cornhuskers saw action against the Pacific coast stars, Rube Howell and Dan McMullen.

"Blue" Shines.

How well do Nebraska football lovers remember that game last year in which the great Blue Howell, Cornhusker fullback, smashed his way across the western goal line to gain the spotlight during the entire game. It was Howell's driving work at the western line that enabled the east to capture the game. The 1927 game saw Glenn Pressnell and Ray Randels of Ne-

braska playing in the all-star lineup from the east.

This year the east-west game will be played on New Year's day in Keizer stadium in San Francisco instead of last week in December as has been the custom in the past. The big classic is sponsored by the Shrine and the gate returns will go to the hospital in San Francisco for crippled children.

Nation's Best.

Coaching the western team this year will be the same staff of coaches as has been in the past, namely, Dick Hanley of Northwestern and Andy Kerr of Colgate. Listed on the all-star eastern lineup will be Nagurski and Bob Tanner of Minnesota, Lou Gordon and Forrest Peters of Illinois, Henry Anderson and Milton Anderson of Northwestern, Elmer Sleight and Ralph Welch of Purdue, Jack Cannon of Notre Dame, Willis Glassgow of Iowa and Lloyd Brazil, star halfback and captain of the University of Detroit team.

Richards will leave for Evanston on Dec. 16 where the squad assembles on Monday for a two or three day practice session before leaving for the west.

The two regular Husker forwards are back, the regular pivot man together with the two regular guards are working out daily on the coliseum floor and if Nebraska can come through with a Big Six championship in basketball this year, it will make it unanimous that the Cornhuskers rule the Big Six. Dutch Witte and Harvey Grace would delight any court coach to start out the season to say nothing of holding the uncanny Don MacLay to hold down the pivot job. But when you throw Lew Lewandowski and Morris Fisher in with the rest, you have what is

known among basketball coaches as "a honey." The season gets under way during the Christmas holidays with the Huskers making an extensive tour of the east meeting some of the stronger quintets in that section of the country and then the Scarlet will return to start its Big Six campaign.

The agreement between officials of the Big Ten and the Southwest conference has been reached and the star football players of those two conferences will meet in Dallas on New Year's day in the annual Dixie Classic sponsored by the Shrine club of Texas. Jimmie Phelen of the conference winning Purdue eleven will coach the all stars from the Big Ten while Ray Morrison of the Southern Methodist champions will tutor the southern stars. Phelen has been given permission to call on Notre Dame stars for the big game and he intends to ask Jack Elder, the Notre Dame flash, to play with the Big Ten stars. The eastern stars will assemble in Chicago on December 23 and from there go to Dallas for a week's workout on the Dallas field.

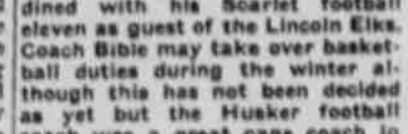
