Report of System in Omaha Bee-News Blames Gish For 'Whizzer.'

DECISION HELPS TEAM

True Conception of Project Will Give Veterans Responsibility.

That the University of Nebraska football team did not want a captain for the entire year of 1930 as has been the custom for the past decade was evidenced by their vote in the annual election held last week before the annual Cornhusker banquet at the Lincoln hotel.

The Bee-News also indicated that Herb Gish, director of athletics at Nebraska had slipped over a "mistake" on the football men in their election which did not appear to be the case after looking over the said ballot which was given to the Cornhuskers.

ing over the said ballot which was given to the Cornhuskers. After looking over the ballot we cannot see how any university football man could have made a mistake unless he balloted with a blindfold. "Are you in favor of a game captain in 1930?" is the way the Omaha Bee-News worded the ballot when in reality the ballot read as follows: "Are you in favor of game captains for 1930?" The injection of one word and cutting off of one letter made a great amount of difference. The Bee-News stated that naturally the ballot was referring to a captain for the entire year which was not the case.

Herb Gish and Coach D. X. Bible stated Monday that the report on the election was not based on facts due to the fact that the wordings in the ballot was not printed correctly. The ballot as given is as follows: "A request has been made by members of the team that the team be allowed to vote on the game captain for 1930. Accordingly the ballot has been arranged thus: Are you in favor of game captains for 1930?"

In the event that a majority of votes is not cast for game captains in the above ballot, my vote is as follows: First choice: Second choice: Third choice: Aid to Team. An interview with members of the athletic department Monday revealed that opinion was unanimous in not electing a captain for the entire year as has been done in the past. In fact a statement prefixed the ballot, stating the opinion of the athletic department as favoring game captains instead of a captain for the year. Herb Gish stated that it was merely an experiment in trying out a plan that would better the Nebraska football team in putting the responsibility on all senior players instead of on one man. Coach Bible, head football coach of the Cornhuskers, agreed that the responsibility on one man's shoulders was too much and did not make for the best kind of football. "With a captain for each of the nine games next year, it will mean that nine men will have full responsibility for the Cornhusker football team and when a captain is named for a game, it will mean more to him to go in and give his all to win the game than to shove off all the responsibility to the captain of the year," Coach Bible stated.

Word has been received this week, however, that she is recovering.

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Negotiations with Denver for a football game on the 1930 gridiron slate seems to be dropped as the D. U. eleven is booked for a game on the only open date for the Huskers and will not be able to meet the Cornhuskers. A nine-game slate is the most desirable from all standpoints but in all probability some team will be found to fit in on the open date before the Huskers meet Pitt. Iowa State is playing a nine-game card next season with Illinois, stated in addition to the Big Six foes. The Ames school is likewise venturing into the southland, playing Rice of Houston on Dec. 6 in a post-season game and Loyola at New Orleans on Nov. 29.

Nebraska followed many other schools Friday evening when they chose to have a football captain for each game during 1930 instead of a captain for the year. Senior members of the team will act as captain during 1930 and the athletic teams at Nebraska from now on will do away with the tradition of electing a leader for the entire season. Announcements from members of the coaching staff at the annual Cornhusker banquet Friday evening made it clear that the teams without captains were far better off than otherwise. The 1930 basketball team is without a captain for the season and no captains have been elected for any of the winter and spring sports at the university.

Missouri is the fifth Big Six football eleven to enter into football contracts with teams from the southwest. In addition to Nebraska, Oklahoma, Iowa State, Kansas State, Missouri has completed arrangements to meet a team from the south. The Tigers have signed a four-year pact with the University of Texas at Austin with the first game at Columbia on Oct. 11. Iowa State has signed Rice and Loyola, Nebraska has signed Texas Aggies. Last season Kansas State met the Texas Aggies while the Sooners took on Texas. The all-star game between the Big Six and the southwest conference last season must have had some effect on the 1929 and 1930 football schedules. Missouri has also ventured out into the Rocky mountain conference and

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signed up the University of Colorado for a two year basis home-and-home.

For those who have Cornhusker football at heart they cannot help but look upon the gridiron relationship of Nebraska and Iowa as a boon to Husker gridiron conditions. There are a chosen few who follow the Big Six and seemingly do not approve of Nebraska meeting the Hawkeyes who were given an open slap in the face for violating Big Ten rules and those chosen few come out with the argument that if the Hawkeyes are not good enough for the Big Ten now the Big Nine then are they good enough for the Big Six? Nebraska and Iowa have for many years been ancient rivals on the gridiron and since the Hawkeyes found that they could not take on as powerful a team as Nebraska with their regular six-game Big Ten schedule, the Cornhuskers were dropped from the Iowa slate. Now that Iowa does not have to meet the six teams in the Big Ten, Nebraska was eager to renew that fine relationship that existed between the two schools for so many years and have accordingly signed the Iowa school on a long time basis. Some say that Iowa was not clean athletically enough for the western loop but is clean enough for the Big Six. As far as that goes, there are many teams in the Big Ten which meet Big Six schools which could fall under the same classification but they are not revealed to John Public for more reasons than one and that one is not only the gate receipts. And as far as Nebraska is concerned, Iowa university is going to make for a fine football relationship between the two schools and a home and home contract over a long period of years
