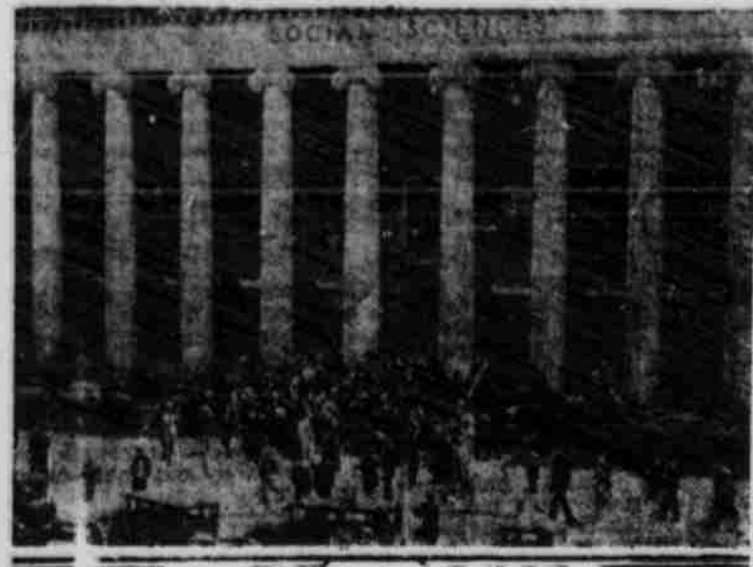
"No person in Nebraska can afford to be unconcerned about the problems of his own finances," declared Dean J. E. LeRossignol, head of the college of business administration of the University of Nebraska.

The college of business administration has for one of its chief purposes the conservation of the millions of dollars which are wasted thru bad business practices, as well as the creation and accumulation of new wealth.

Other services rendered by the college include work in business research, which has been of great value to Nebraska business men; and the service rendered by members of the staff of the college by participating in the meetings of various associations and civic clubs.

While the college is young as colleges go, it has already a large number of graduates most of whom have done extremely well in the business world.

University Educates Nebraska Boys And Girls All Year Round; Never Idle

Almost every week day of the year the University of Nebraska is kept busy educating Nebraska boys and girls. With summer school, the physical plant of the university does not stand idle for several months during the summer as is the case with many school buildings in the state.

During the winter months of the regular school year the physical plant is taxed to capacity to accommodate the more than 6,000 students who daily take work.

University of Texas Puts Sororities And Fraternities Under Drastic Rules

Quite different from the University of Nebraska situation, sororities and fraternities at the University of Texas have been placed under drastic regulation by the board of regents of that institution.

Sororities Hostesses. "Any social function given by a sorority," say the rules, "shall be given for the members of the single group, who act as hostesses, and their men guests, provided the number of men does not exceed twice the number of hostesses, and provided that no student may be invited who has not established eligibility for initiation."

Scholarship is Basis. At any time low scholarship will exclude a fraternity from the Texas campus. Rushing is controlled by prohibiting rushing of any student until he has established his eligibility. Prior to the establishment of such eligibility, rushees may not visit a chapter house or enter its premises, or attend any social function given by or for such organizations.

In 1913 he was made a member of the senate and given the rank of dean. In 1915 he was made corporation secretary of the board of regents.

As secretary he is a statutory officer of and is elected by the board of regents of the university. He attends the various meetings and keeps an accurate record of all the proceedings of the board and also performs all the other duties of a corporation secretary.
