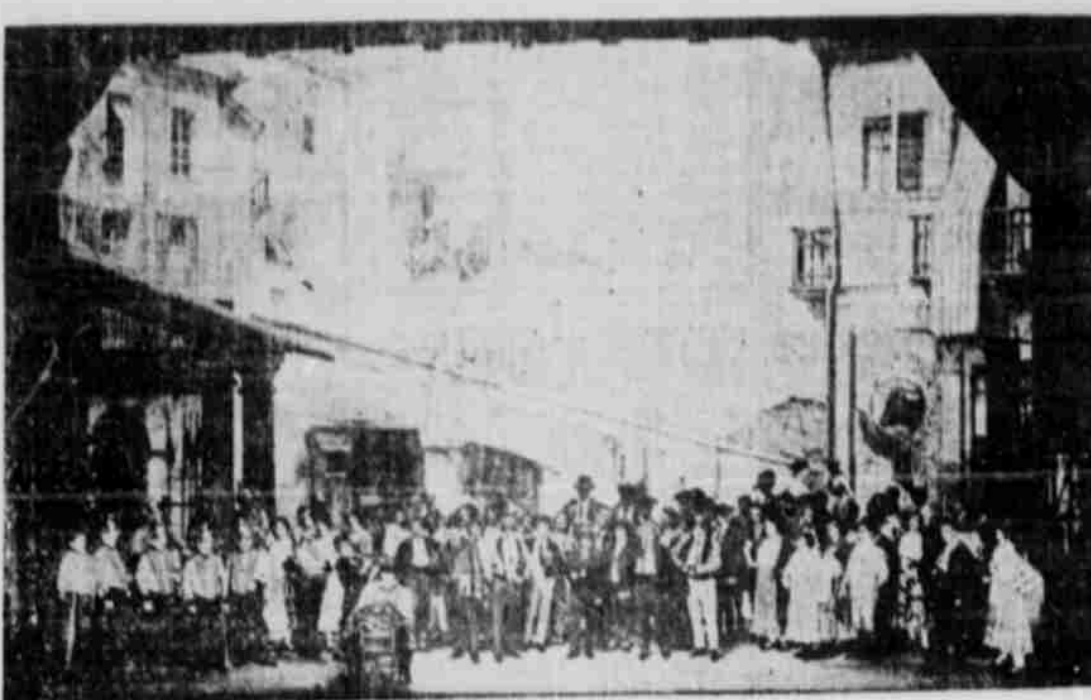

It is this quality in Scotland which accounts for the pre-eminence of Scotsmen in the politics and business of the British empire, believes the Lord Bishop.
