RARE BOOKS ARE ON DISPLAY IN LIBRARY

Volumes Printed As Early As 1603 Are Placed On Exhibition.

Again a new collection of books has been placed on display at the main library in the case at the entrance. Miss Stephens organized this set and it was placed on display a short time ago.

One of the larger volumes, size about ten by sixteen inches, shows a picture of William Shakespeare. Across from this is a poem ending, "Look not upon his picture, but on his book."

The books are of two sizes. The smaller volumes are about the size of books used in grade school. The books are slightly thicker, however. One book of small size is written by Ben Jonson, a contemporary of Shakespeare.

The year 1885 when the fourth folio was printed no other collection of editions appeared until Rowe's in the year 1709-10. Nicholas Rowe was the earliest critical editor.

One book on display is an especially rare edition. It was printed only one hundred years after the first quarto. Altogether there are about nine books in this display.

"Mr. Jenks ranks high and of all actors I have ever seen take the part of Hamlet, does not fall rivaling the best in main particulars," declared Dr. L. A. Sherman, professor of English and ranking dean of the university.

Dr. Sherman, who is a nationally known Shakespearean critic, is the author of the book "What is Shakespeare" as well as numerous articles on the subject. He has also taught Shakespeare for many years at the university and edited "Machbeth," "Hamlet," and "Twelfth Night."

Dr. Sherman admitted that he has seen "Hamlet" performed over ten times and with such noted actors in the lead as Edwin Booth, Richard Mansfield, and Lawrence Barrett.

"The play was very carefully studied and put on," maintained Dr. Sherman. "Mr. Jenks more nearly than most represents the Viking and explosive power of Norse kingship."

The time is then extended to 3 o'clock. There is little friction between the fraternity and sorority groups and the non-Greeks. Most of the men are fraternity men.
Church or chapel attendance is not compulsory, but beginning next year it will be. Athletic finances are handled by the school. Each student must pay \$10 for which he receives a ticket entitling him to all athletic privileges.
Credits from Iowa, Ohio State, Illinois and Indiana will participate in a swimming meet. This is the only intercollegiate competition in which women are allowed to participate.
