each section, and will take an hour to place the huge awning over the playing field. The cover will have a dual use, to protect the field from the rain and snow, and to keep it from freezing, thus putting it in tip top shape for all contests. Not Many Used. According to Director of Athletics H. D. Gish, Nebraska university is the first school in the Big Six conference, and the only one in this section of the country to have the advantages of having a field protector. There are five schools in the Big Ten who have them, and any number of schools further east are using the gigantic "umbrellas."

The first thorough inspection of the canvas will be made next week, probably Wednesday, when the cover will be placed on the field by sections, and an inspection will be made to see whether it meets all requirements. The sections lie flat, with a foot overlap, which will be weighted down to protect the field and keep the canvas in place. It will be taken up and replaced after Thursday's practice, with that procedure being a daily program from then on. Cost \$4,500. The gigantic covering was purchased through the Lincoln Tent and Awning company and was made by the Rogers Tent and Awning company of Fremont. The cover, and all of the carrying apparatus were purchased last summer by the university at an expenditure of approximately \$4,500. The covering has been stored in sections on the band platform, at the edge of the grid iron, since it's arrival at the university.

K. U. STARTING 65TH YEAR. The sixty-fifth year of instruction at the University of Kansas opens next week. First classes of the university met Sept. 12, 1866, in the one building that then constituted the university. There were three members of the faculty and fifty-five students, all in the preparatory department. Enrollment this year will exceed \$200 and the faculty numbers 250 260. The university plant now includes a campus of 160 acres at Lawrence, with twenty-five major buildings and a complete athletic equipment for intramural and intercollegiate athletics; and a five acre tract at Kansas City with five large buildings for the school of medicine. The university plant is estimated to be worth \$5,000,000.

HUGE CANVASS COVER PROTECTS STADIUM SOG. Rain or shine, snow or sleet, the Nebraska football fans will be assured of a dry playing field during the present football season, as the new field protector will insure all players of the best possible playing conditions. The new canvas protector of ten ounce water proofed canvas is made up in eight sections, each one measuring ninety feet square, and weighing 1,200 pounds when dry. It is estimated that it will take about fifteen men to handle

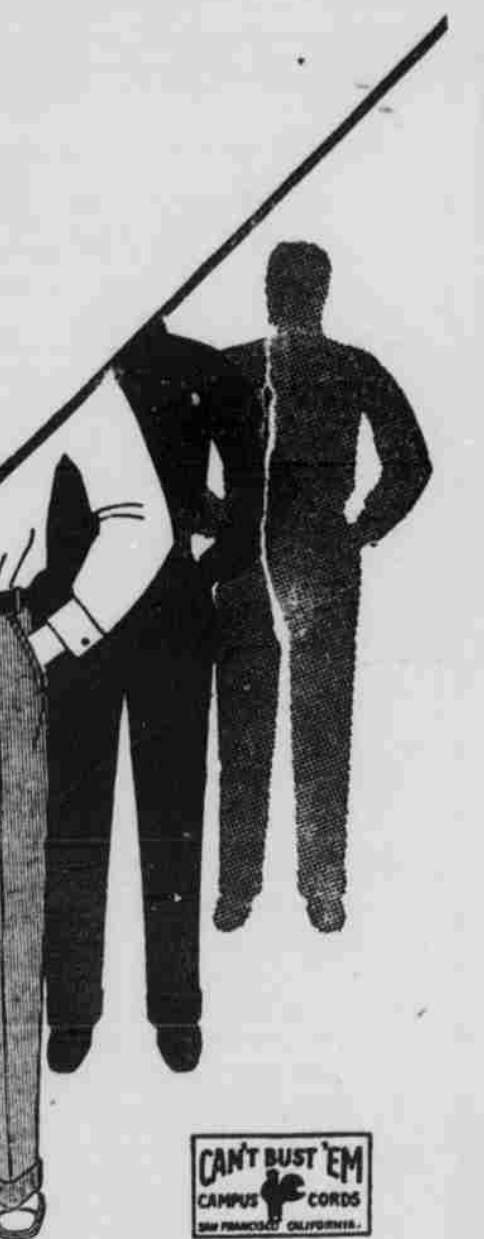
