Experiences of William Thompson Range From Pastor to Trouper and Broadway Actor; Is Teacher Here

Mr. Thompson comes to the campus from the Clement-From the pulpit to a tent show, from tent shows to the legitimate state and from that to a university instructor is the strange and varied tale of the experiences of William F. Thompson, who takes the part of Trotter in the University Players' current production, "Journey's End."

Mr. Thompson comes to the campus from the Clement Walsh players in Omaha. He is teaching English and taking his M. A. degree in that department this year.

Served in War. After graduation from Hamline university at St. Paul in 1917, Mr. Thompson enlisted in the war. While in France, he was honored with the medal d'honneur for his work during the influenza epidemic.

MORE THAN 100 JOIN IN DEBATING LEAGUE

Bibliographies of Material Compiled on Question For This Year.

Prof. H. A. White of the English department, who is in charge of the state high school debating league, reported Wednesday that more than 100 high schools have signed up as members of the league for the 1931 season.

Bibliographies of all information which is related to the question for the coming season have been compiled by the university and have been mailed to all schools who have joined the league thus far.

This is the twenty-fourth year in which the high schools of Nebraska, under the direction of the University of Nebraska, have joined in debating a single question which terminates in the spring with a state tournament between the most outstanding teams.

FOLLOW UP ON PORK PROJECTS PLANNED

Farm to Farm Survey Will Check Results of Special Train.

Three farm-to-farm surveys will be made the last two weeks of October, to find the actual situation regarding the hog lot sanitation project of the agricultural college extension service.

Eight men will work in each crew and cover each township in two days. Each man will use a questionnaire with which he will check over the methods of hog raising used by each farmer he visits.

Survey Is Follow Up. The survey is a follow up project of the Burlington Profitable Pork special operated in the state in October, 1929, and also of the seven year old hog lot sanitation project of the extension service.

Will Check Details. The questionnaire card will make it possible to check the equipment and methods used by the farmer in handling his brood sows, in farrowing them, and in taking care of his pigs.

One check has already been made on the effectiveness of the Profitable Pork special. From a survey of lumber yards it is definitely known that 5,113 approved individual and two sow hog houses were sold by the lumber yards and that material for 8,072 houses was sold to farmers following the Profitable Pork special.
